1. May and June meeting notes have not been reviewed to be accepted. They are still in draft form. A Commission Bar-B-Que was held on July 3 at Gregg Lake. A kayak was planned but the weather (wind & rainstorm shortened the event). August meeting only 2 members available so it was cancelled. A Conservation Table was manned at Home & Harvest. Several people showed interest with the Open Space Committee. September meeting was cancelled due to illness & people being unavailable.

- 2. Campbell Pond Peter to contact Kyle Lombard to review Hemlock Wooly Alegid outbreak at Campbell Pond. Ron has volunteered to be Con Com contact. More on the HWA as an invasive pest may be found at the NHBUGS web site below.
- 3. Hurlin Property has been mowed. Peter met with Caleb Platt in July. Property was mowed in September. Peter checked the cut in October & said it looks great!!! The property has some substantial trees that need cutting. We will try to schedule that in the winter. The Platt family made a generous donation of the cut work to the Town. Peter to send a thank you note from the Town via the commission.
- 4. Peter checked the Lily Pond Trail and it is in need of work and re-blazing.
- 5. Ron & Peter cleaned the Meadow Marsh Trail of the down trees & some brush.
- **6.** Road work on Brimstone Road. Frank to keep on top of. It seems the rogue road work has been going on again.

- 11. <u>Emerald Ash Borer</u> discussed More info may be found at <u>www.NHBUGS.org</u> Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) is a non-native insect, EAB lacks predators to keep it in check. Infested trees die within 3 to 5 years. EAB only attacks ash trees, and is responsible for the death of millions of ash trees in the midwest. Help protect New Hampshire's ash trees. A <u>quarantine of all hardwood firewood</u>, ash wood-products and all ash nursery stock is in effect for Belknap, Hillsborough, Merrimack and Rockingham Counties
- **12.** <u>Antrim 2020</u> was held Oct 22. A great time was had by all. One of the potential out comes was a need to better sign & mark town trails. A group of interested citizens are to meet on November 9 to form a committee to take action. Peter will attend.
