On July 28, 1966 the Antrim Planning Board met in the Selectmen's Office at 7:30 P. M. Present were Byron Butterfield, Howard Humphrey, Sr., Eleanor Lane, Charles Gilmore, Robert Flanders and Mildred Dudley.

Charles Gilmore is to act as Ex Officion for the Board of Selectmen.

The Secretary' report was approved as read.

Voted: Byron Butterfield, Chairman and Mildred Dudley Secretary.

Voted: That the third Thursday in each month will be the regular meeting night for the Antrim Planning Board.

After discussion it was decided that the projects in order of importance are:

- l. To determind what we can do about the road owned by Roger Hilton.
- 2. Publicity To make the public aware of the Antrim Planning Board and its duties.
- 3. Explain to Town our project and problems.

Mr. Humphrey agreed to approach Mr. Hilton regarding the road situation and report results at the next meeting.

The Secretary was asked to write an article for the Papers regarding the reorganization of the Board, the date of the meetings and the officers appointed by the Selectmen and to make the public aware of our existence and what we are trying to accomplish.

It was the consensus of opinion that the greates problem facing us at present is "Housing". The suggestion was made that perphps we could interest a contractor in buying land and build a new development with houses to range in price from \$13,000.00 to \$16,000.00. This, of course, would be a long range program. The location of land suitable for a project of this kind is also a problem.

It was also suggested that we find an artichect to draw a plan of a housing development such as we have in mind, with streets, roads, etc., to provide a contractor with necessary ideas. The name of Howard Humphrey, Jr. was suggested for such a project.

As the Board is open to any constructive ideas and suggestions, we would welcome anyone to attend our meetings and make these ideas known to us.

Robert Flanders moved that we adjourn - seconded by Eleanor Lane.
