A meeting of the Antrim Planning Board was held at the Selectmen's Office on the above date with the following present:

Howard Humphry, Sr., Harold Grant, Robert Flanders, Dana Healey, Stanley Tenney, Robert Caughey, Merle Aborn and Mildred Dudley.

Robert Caughey wrot to the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission in Concord for their opinion re: private individual sewers instead of going in the project with Bennington. They would not recommend this for approval and we would not be eligible for State aid in this case.

Re: Closing old dump, it was thought State would approve this if Stanley Tenney would let us use some of this land needed to take care of the situation which now exists. If Stanley would agree to this the Town would deed the land on which the dump is now located to him, and the Town would have no more responsibility for the dump.

A letter was read from the Selectmen to Stanley Tenney re: closing of the dump and a letter from Stanley Tenney to Selectmen accepting the terms with reservations.

To close the dump will cost between \$4,000 and %5,000.

Other location for dump (Smith Road to Elm Avenue) not yet approved by State.

Planning Board project for the future will be to look into roads with gates and bars and roads not passable to see what action should be taken. Bob Caughey has a list presented to Planning Board by Merle Aborn and will indicate them on a map which he has and this will be brought up at the next meeting.

It was suggested that something be done about parking on the sidewalks in the Town.

Robert Caughey was elected to the Planning Board to take the unexpired term of Byron Butterfield.
