Jim Dennison opened the meeting at 7:40 pm. The minutes of 9 January 86 were approved as written.

Mr. Dennison read the annual report which will be submitted for town meeting in March, 1986.

Knapton Subdivision (file #85-4)


Lloyd Henderson, town counsel, joined the discussion of the Knapton Subdivision of Franklin Pierce Lake. He has talked with the Antrim Selectmen, Hank Cutter (AFD Chief) and the town of Hillsboro regarding a "mutual assistance agreement" for fire and/or police protection between our two towns, in general, and in particular as it would pertain to the proposed subdivision. Such an agreement must be well conceived since some legal problems remain: even if Hillsboro agrees to respond to emergency calls, Antrim is not without liability. A case pending in Derrig, N.H. was cited as an example of Antrim's potential problems.

Discussion continued regarding the stone arch bridge on the Second NH Turnpike just north of the entrance to Barden Hill Rd. Fire trucks from Hillsboro or the Antrim North Branch fire stations must cross this bridge to reach Mountain Rd. This bridge is posted for a maximum of three (3) tons, and Antrim Chief Cutter states that he will not permit any Antrim fire equipment to cross this bridge. As an alternative, fire equipment could come from the south on the Second NH Turnpike but this is a longer route; and therefore, does not allow the same quality of fire protection. Mr. Dennison will write Mr. Knapton a letter stating a second public hearing can be held with approval of the subdivision subject to opening the discontinued portion of Mountain Side Rd.

Mr. Dennison has had no success in finding a clerk for the PB (see minutes of 9 Jan 85). It is hoped a clerk will work for both the PB and the BOA. The search continues.

Meeting adjourned at 8:35 pm.
