Minutes of Selectmen's meeting June 23, 1975

All three Selectmen were present.

Mr. Hardwick was asked to explain the premium for the Workmen's Compensation insurance. He said that the premium was based on the type of work and the accident experience of the policy. The current high rates are because we have Highway Department employees covered under the policy, and because of the accident at the dump a few years age.

Pat Nevak was in and asked the Selectmen to consider the application for Discretionary Easement for Andy Lane. The Selectmen reserved judgment until the Planning Board has made its decision. She also said that her father had decided to look into Land Use. Her father is Rebert Munhall.

Mr. Richardsen asked the Selectmen about the extra Liability Insurance he has to carry, because people pay their tax bills at his house, the price has new increased to \$28.00. The Selectmen agreed that the tewn should pay this.

Rebert Themas was in to inquire about hew the tax on shere property on Franklin Pierce Lake is computed. It seems that there is a piece of property that he thought he was paying taxes on that wasn't his. The Selectmon answered his questions, and showed him that he wasn't paying taxes on anything that wasn't his.

The Selectmen veted to put sterm and screen windows on the windows in the outter office used by the secretary and Tax Cellecter.

Lleyd Hendersen reperted to the Selectmen about the suits of Nathaniel Hawtherne College and William Edwards. As to Hewtherne College, he says that he can't see any reason for the suit, and we'll wait and see. About the Cilley suit, he talked to Bill Edwards and he is willing to negotiate.

The question was raised about the Conval Budget Advisory Committee, and the Selectmon unanumously agreed to send Heward Humphrey Sr. to represent them. The first meeting will be June 26, 1975. The secretary will send aletter and inform him.

Chief Craig reported to the Selectmen: He asks that the Selectmen send a letter to Ed Bishop and him to turn in his equipment. The secretary will do this. He also reported that there will be a bey raking the beach at Gregg Lake to repair the damage that this bey did. The Chief feels that perhaps this will be better than taking him to court.

The Chief has some signs that he will give to Merle Abern to put up.
