

Minutes of Selectmen's Meeting June 30, 1975

All Selectmen were present

Mr. Richardson asked about the cemeteries, the Selectmen agreed that he should do as he has done in the past, if he wants to take the responsibility.

Martin Nichols notified the Selectmen that he would be on vacation from July 4 until July 8.

Christie Ellinwood inquired about the land owned by the town known as the old Keene Road, he wants to buy it. The Selectmen will find out the exact location. They told him he would have to do this through Town Meeting.

A gentleman, who is building on the top of Lovern Mill Road wanted to know about the upkeep of the road. The Selectmen said that they believed that, the part of the road in question is in Windsor. The same man wants to put a trailer on this lot, the Selectmen told him to go to the building inspector and then through the Planning Board and the Board of Adjustment. They told him he could camp on his land as long as he didn't make anything permanent.

The Park Department met with the Board of Selectmen, they discussed buying a lifesaving tube, the life guards believe that this would be an invaluable aid in the performance of their duties.

Mr. Richard^{is} is giving two tables, one this year and one next year, these tables are to be set in cement so they won't go missing.

There was some discussion about the length of the beach, Keith Sosneskie, the fellow who is doing the Tax Map said that it was about 170 feet.

Mrs. Craig asked about the locks for the cars, nobody seems to know where they are. She also complained about how often the barrels are emptied.

The Park Department said that it seems to be caught up.

There was some discussion about using youth corps workers for the summer but it didn't seem to be a good idea.

Joe Tatre had an idea about controlling Non Residents at the beach by using Dump Stickers as identification. He said that there must be some control as there are large crowds of people using the beach on weekends. He mentioned that perhaps this could be controlled by charging people. An Ordinance will be made that this beach is for Residents and Taxpayers only. There will also be an Ordinance to keep dogs off the beach, but they will use the signs for now.

It was ascertained that the Lifeguard's duty is to stay on the beach and to protect the beach. The town will not be responsible before 9:AM, and after 5:30 PM.

The Park Department believes that there should be a Police Trainee at the beach on Weekends to control traffic and to be available if the Lifeguards need him for any situation that they cannot control.

The Selectmen agreed that there should be a fence at the Tennis Court on the water side, this will be installed.

Lee Marshall spoke to the Park Department and the Selectmen about setting up a committee to investigate and plan a year round Recreation Program, he said that he could get a number of interested people to participate. The Selectmen felt that this was a good idea and gave him the go ahead. He and the people he has in mind will be meeting with the Park Department in the near future.

The Selectmen agreed to try the copier
