

Minutes of The Selectmen's Meeting September 8, 1975

All three Selectmen were present.

Douglas Moughton was in to request a building permit. He now meets the land size specifications. The Selectmen told him that if this was so he should go to the Building Inspector with an application for a Building Permit. He was given an application.

Pat Webber reported that someone was building on Elm Avenue, The Selectmen will look into it.

We have a letter for the Rescue Squard, The Selectmen will find out who is handling correspondence for the Antrim Rescue Squard.

The Board of Adjustment and the Planning Board are still in need of Alternates the Boards have names and will give them to the Selectmen.

A representative of Public Service met with the Selectmen and Lloyd Henderson Town Counsel to discuss the litagation that is pending in regard to their tax bill for 1973. Inasmuch as the 1974 tax bill was not appealed, they thought that they might discuss the 1975 tax bill that is in the future. The representative of Public Service submitted the company's figures and asked the Selectmen to consider them. The meeting ended on a pleasant note but nothing was resolved.

The Selectmen discussed the possibility of a land sale. The Selectmen agreed that it should be at public auction, but no date was set.

The Selectmen agreed that something should be set up with Ted Garfield the Dog Officer, about the dogs running loose in Antrim. Since Ted has been sick he hasn't been able to pick up the dogs himself, so maybe someone could be appointed to pick them up for him.

Jane Remacle made a formal complaint against the Police Department. The accident she was in on March 30 has been settled by the insurance company. The young men that were involved got off because the Police Department did not prosecute. The Selectmen will take this under advisement.
