Minutes of the Selectmen's Meeting March 8, 1976

Edward C. Clarke, Chairman presiding and Richard O. Schacht present.

Charles Gilmore met with the Selectmen to discuss the topic of the meeting in regard to the changes that the State intends to make on Route 31 at the foot of Twiss Hill. Mr. Gilmore will explain the proposed changes to the public. The Selectmen will have two petitions available for the public to sign, one will be for the changes and one will be against.

Earl Brady asked the Selectmen about veteran's exemption and they gave him an application.

The Tax Collector discussed Yeild Tax Deposits, up til now he has been holding the checks, but he has talked with other tax collectors and they feel that they should be deposited. Begining next week he will give them to the Treasurer to deposit and a separate accounting of them will be made in the Selectmen's account book.

Merle Aborn took the bid and he will compare it to estimates he will receive from Perry Motors and Crysler Plymouth in Keene. He says that he should have the information by March 15. (this is in regard to the new Town Truck)

Clark Craig, Police Chief talked to the Selectmen about the new cruiser. He will need a purchase order from the Selectmen, Ed Clarke instructed the secretary to write a letter which will serve as a purchase order all three Selectmen will sign it.

The Chief also mentioned a complaint from Mr. Saville on Main Street about an early morning disturbance at the Studio Resturant on Main Street. Mr. Saville objects to the noise that is caused by the resturant being open in the early morning hours. ED Clarke said that they will discuss this when all the Selectmen are present.

The Chairman asked the Chief about the RSA Books that the Selectmen had asked him to order. He will check.

The Chairman also mentioned a complaint from Lindsay of Lindsay Bus Service about who authorized the removal of his bus when it went off the road. The Chief said that he must have indirectly because he told the people who pulled it off the road that it should be moved before anothe accident happened.
