

Minutes of Selectmen's Meeting May 24, 1976

Mr. and Mrs. Peter Merrifield met with the Selectmen.
Peter Merrifield discussed the Guy A. Tibbetts scholarship fund and who will be presenting it. The scholarship will be given to students who are already out of school so there will be no problem.

Peter Merrifield also discussed the status of Gregg Lake. He said that he had talked to someone at the State level and although Gregg Lake is said to be a Class B Lake this means that it is to be used for recreation and not for drinking water. The State Chemist says that the water is perfectly all right for recreational purposes. If you want the water analyzed the residents must be prepared for whatever happens because the state will have to follow through with whatever pollution they find.

Nancy Merrifield spoke about the Library. The only bid that was returned for the Library fence was from George Edwards. The Trustees think that it is too high and they are looking for a fence company to see if it can be done for less money.

Sue Craig presented the bill for the fence at Gregg Lake, the damage done to the fence before it was put up will be recovered from the parents of the people who did the damage.

Sue Craig also presented a plan to finish the boat ramp and parking lot Clark A. Craig Jr. will do it at his convenience for \$175.00. Eric Tenney pointed out that this was not a budgeted item and asked Mrs. Craig if she felt the budget could stand it, she said that she and Harold Grant thought it should be done. The Selectmen told her to go ahead.

It was mentioned that they would need another member of the Park Board, Mrs. Craig will bring in some names for the Selectmen to consider.

The Ballfield was brought up and it was suggested that the Selectmen ask the school for some help in maintaining the field since they make use of it much of the time. Peter Merrifield came back into the Selectmen's room and they talked about the Antrim Gymnasium and the Ballfield, Peter suggested that a Selectmen get in touch with the Superintendent and discuss the School's responsibility since the Gymnasium and the Ballfield belong to the Town.

The Selectmen instructed the Secretary to send a note to David Ross and ask him to meet with the Selectmen at their next meeting June 7, 1976.

The Selectmen asked that a letter be sent to Joseph Hyland to see if he will be a member of the Town Barn Committee.

The Selectmen agreed that a log should be kept by the Police Officer on duty. It could be kept in the cruiser and at the Police Station Office in the Town Hall.

The Selectmen agreed that the Building Inspector should submit the Building Permits on a weekly basis.
