

Minutes of Selectmen's Meeting June 14, 1976

Edward C. Clarke and Eric F. Tenney present, Edward C. Clarke presiding

Jim Rymes of the Rescue Squad asked the Selectmen for permission to sell the ambulance that was bought for practice purposes last year. The Selectmen agreed that if the money expended was returned any profit that was made could be used by the Rescue Squad. A bill of sale was prepared and the vehicle was sold to Kenneth Sears of Antrim, New Hampshire.

Adolf Baer called the Selectmen and accepted the appointment to the Town Barn Committee.

The Bicentennial Committee, that is, Barry Proctor, Isabel Nichols, and Dorothy Lang met with the Selectmen to discuss plans for the fourth of July Celebration at Gregg Lake. Chief Craig was called in to add his opinion to the plans for parking cars and handling the crowd while the fireworks are being displayed. The Chief is against the fireworks at the beach but he will co-operate with the committee, and he will see about getting extra policemen to handle the cars. Barry Proctor will get in touch with Bud Hardwick to see about insurance and see about getting someone to set up the fireworks so that they are used as safely as possible. The Committee will have a problem financing the affair and the Selectmen asked for a statement of expenses so that they can see what they can do to help. The Bicentennial Committee will get back to the Selectmen next week.

Phebe Lewan asked the secretary to let the Selectmen know that her committee would be glad to help the Selectmen in appointing the new members of the Conservation Committee. The Selectmen accepted her offer.

Merle Aborn told the Bicentennial Committee that Meeting House Hill was not wide enough for a regular length bus to turn around and they will probably have to use vans for their vesper service on the Fourth of July. He said that the road is not too bad but it is very narrow. Nonetheless he will have it ready by the Fourth.
