

Minutes of Selectmen's Meeting December 13, 1976

All three Selectmen present, Edward C. Clarke presiding

Mrs. Rita Allison met with the Selectmen to protest her assessment, she believes that the value is set too high. The Selectmen directed her to appeal to Concord. Mrs. Allison took an application to make such an appeal.

Mr. Leroy Meyer applied for a Veteran's Exemption, The Selectmen told him that it would not apply until 1977.

The Selectmen directed the secretary to check for bids on the Town Report for 1976. She will call some publishers tomorrow.

The Selectmen discussed the problem of auditors for 1976. They instructed the secretary to put an ad in the paper asking for applications for this position.

Clark Craig Jr. Met with the Selectmen to discuss possible locations for a Town Barn, The Selectmen suggested that he get some firm prices and then they will get together and formulate an article for the Warrant.

Dick Schacht presented a tentative program for the celebration of Antrim's Bicentennial in 1977. The Selectmen looked it over and discussed it at some length. Additional expenses to be considered will be extra police and clean up.

Clark Craig Sr., Police Chief met with Selectmen and they discussed the problem of "DOGS" in the village area. Chief Craig said that Ted Garfield will now take dogs to board until there is some disposition made. Now all that they have to do is find someone to pick them up. The Chief will try to see John Grant and determine what his status is.

The Selectmen signed checks and paid the Town Officers for the 1976 year.
