

Selectmen's Meeting Monday, April 27, 1981

Meeting came to order at 7:30 PM: Present Katherine Ring, Leslie MacNeil, Paul Mercier, Chairman, Representing the Messenger, Carol S.

Checks were signed, Decision was made as to what amounts were to be rolled over on CD's in the coming week.

It was decided that this year all inventories not received by the due date were subject to a \$10.00 fine. This includes all received from April 15 to the present. A further decision will be made on all not filed.

There was a postponement on the signing with Farmer's Home since all needed material was not in hand.

It was decided that no future bills will be paid to Anderson Nichols until the work is completed to the satisfaction of all.

It has been reported by the Sewer Comm. that Aiken St. sewer pipes were down only Three feet and the depth should be about eight feet. Installation on entire street has been put off until corrections can be made. Run off on Aiken St. is also a problem.

It was decided to put advertisement into paper for bids on fuel oil to all town buildings. Bids will be accepted thru May 15, 7:30 PM.

George Cole Has done a good job putting culvitt in North Branch. TRA must be used on town roads and GC will look into possibility or resurfacing three roads in town with money.

Paul suggested a detail report to be prepared and go to the town meeting showing roads needing repairs and what is needed to do the job.

A Master plan has been suggested for the roads. Also what is expected from the Highway Department and what the Highway Dept. can expect from the Town. This will include the days off etc. Last year the road crew the worst places and will do as much as can be done with the funds available.

Lloyd Henderson will be asked what is the pollicy for extending a roadway. "Smokey" Merle's road has been used by the town for years and the town would benifit if we extent the road from Buttercup Lane to West St. Does this have to go in the town warrant?

A letter is to go out to Commander Office, 210 Engineers, Peterborough asking for use of bulldozer for two days, one in May and the other the latter part of June or July to move fill on ½ acre area for new recreational area.

Jim Dennison spoke of Master Plan. There have been many new permits for buildings. 7th of May there will be a meeting of the Planning Board. Picture where the town is today and where it is going in the years to come. What do we want it to look like in the future?

Mr. Dick Pleasance, Recycling Study Comm. Meeting for all interested parties May 5 at 8PM in the Town hall. Dick spoke about the extensive use in Frankestown for 1½ years. He was encouraged to keep the Selectmen informed of other coming meetings and results of same should the selectmen not make them. Renegotiation in June for Landfill use. Hours may change at that time. Renegotiation of three town by Dec. 81. Perhaps recycling can be started before that date. A special Town Meeting can only be called in the event of an emergency therefore nothing can be done before the Town Report.

Lloyd will be asked for a form letter for people who need building permits but fail to apply for one.

A question on Springer hook up. Selectmen will talk to Sewer Commission in regards to who will pay the hook-up costs of this account since it was installed after the sewer was in place on High St.
