## Selectmen's Meeting, Monday, June 1, 1981

Paul Mercier, Chairman, Katherine Ring, Leslie MacNeil met at 7:30 at which time they signed checks, tax warrant, building permits.

Ann Hennesey, and Doris Gilman of the Library Trustees were in and recommended Pam Boorum be replaced by Jane Miller. They are looking to keep a balance of age group.

Doris was sworn in at this time.

Brian Brown gave a weekly report. Quiet week for this time of year. Chris is doing well at the academy. It was agreed at chis time that any door to door salespersons will clear it with the police dept.

Henry Cutter was informed that the fire dept will not be filling swimming pools from now on as they are on meter, and there are chemicals in the water.

All repairs to any building in the towns ownership will be repaired at the towns expense and then there will be no problem in where the money is coming from and how to pay it back. Firemen have made considerable changes in the fire house without town approval, and the question of keeping funds earned at functions to pay back the fire men was discussed at some length. When the town has approved repairs, money will come from the town and when firemen are running different functions the money will go back into the town account to cover any repairs. Since the men have laid out about \$1,500. It may be possible for them to recoup some if not all of their money by having a money making function or renting the hall. But in the future all is to be down through the Town Meeting and the Selectmen's office.
