

Selectmen's Meeting, Monday, June 8, 1981

Meeting started at 7:30 with Paul Mercier, Chairman, Katherine Ring, Leslie MacNeil, and Carolyn Straub of the Messenger were present.

Checks, pole licenses for Public Service, building permits were signed.

Paul mentioned letters had to go out to Antrim graduates this week. Mark Tenney is to be called for list of names.

Beverly Amadon was in and asked what can be done to eliminate a problem she is having with sand coming across her property from the town roads. George Cole will be told of the problem and a barrier of some kind will be erected, or the road will be graded to overcome problem.

Tim Brown is to be in touch with George Cole to figure how much fill and what size area is to be covered on Jamison Ave.

Don Madden would like a no parking sign on his street to prevent accidents with the young people playing ball and running out in the street from between parked cars. George Cole will be notified.

Jim Rymes was in to talk about a piece of property that is of no use to him and which is a taxable piece at this time. Since he can't deed it to the town and he can use it for no worthwhile purpose he wished to have an abatement of the taxes. Paul suggested he make out an abatement form and the town will have Gilmore look at it before making a decision.

Bookkeeper took this time to ask if the agreement with Jim was to have all bills paid within ten days of delivery and not ten days of receipt of bill. Concern that the office may not receive a notice from different depts. as to delivery and perhaps not get a check out within the ten days. Jim said he used to be an easy person to do business with until....Hopefully there will be no problem with dates and some lee way.

William Gutgesell's accident was not reported to the Workmens' Comp back in November. Will call and see what can be done to clear up this account. If Co. will not honor claim due to late notice, the town will pick up bill.

Katherine Ring tracked down the plane donated to the town by the Air Force and found that Hawthorne College had it and at this time it is in many pieces. Original agreement with the government was for the town to return it at town expense. After talking it over with the college, Katherine managed to get them to assume responsibility for the return of said property.
