

Minutes, Selectmen's Meeting, May 3, 1982

Present: Katherine Ring, Chairman, Leslie MacNeil, John Jones, Betty Shaw, Secretary, and David Grossman from the Messinger.

Jack Mulhall was in to see if he can have permission to have a session stand at the lake this summer. The selectmen talked about it and pointed out that there may be a fee, and once he has established a business at the beach, he has no guarantee that someone else will also request permission and be granted it. A decision was not made at this time.

Ed Clark asked if the road agent can drop off some fill to repair damage to his lawn caused by the plow this winter. He will do the work and pay for the seed to put his property back to what it was before the plow dug up the lawn just as long as he can have some fill. Permission was granted.

Sally may not be in for tax sale on Thursday but will appoint someone in case she can not make it. Permission granted.

Adolph Baer, and Ann Bline complained about the condition of property adjoining their places. Selectmen will look into the problem of the possible fire hazard and health problem from sewerage. Lloyd was in and spoke to all in regard to the problems on the property. Lloyd will be in contact with the owners of the property and see what can be done. (Brad Routen and Gary Blindt)

Brian Brown said the cruiser will go to the second highest bidder if the selectmen approve since the highest bidder would like out of the agreement. Selectmen approved and James Smith will be notified that he can pick up the cruiser for \$900.00.

Dispatch understood why Antrim will be going County next year in order to cut corners. Brian will check on the value of property belonging to Antrim, at the dispatch center.

Joe Grabowski was in to speak of his formal complaint about the Antrim Library. They have once again refused him permission to hang up notices on the board at the library. Selectmen explained they have no say as to what the library does. The Trustees have full charge of the library since they are not funded by the town. He spoke of having paid late charges and money for lost books and being refused receipts for his money. He had papers with him to show the selectmen what he wanted to put up and the selectmen read some of them, but still could not help him..

George Cole said the conditions on the roads in White Birch Point are in poor condition and will need work. Secondary roads are still closed to heavy trucking for another week. They will be open on May 10.
