

Selectmen's Meeting, Monday, Aug/ 16, 1982

Selectmen met at 7:30

Bob Flanders was in to discuss the coming elections, and to let the Selectmen know that all of the budget committee have resigned. He hoped to be able to talk one or two into remaining on the committee to help set up the budget for the coming year.

The selectmen signed the salary agreement for the Highway Dept. and a copy was given to the the Road Agent, George Cole. Signed also was a welfare form and an Intent to cut for Bob Riley.

Gally Martel's letter of resignation was accepted with regret by the Selectmen. It was agreed to advertise for a new tax collector applications and resumes go be gone over on Wednesday, August 25 at 7:30.. Interviews will be held on the 30th of the month. Les MacNeil will not be here as he is going on vacation. The other two selectmen will have to make the final decision.

Corrections on the land amounts on the Strepka and Day files were made. Strepka sold land to Day, but for years the amount of land listed with the home and the barn were reversed. Home on 1.3 barn on 8.3 not home on 8.3 etc.

After checking the revenue sharing book it was found that we are in compliance with the laws governing the revenue sharing. No special meeting will be needed. All were thankful for that.

Mr. Weeks from N.H.M. Bond Bank was in and explained the process of bonding with the selectmen. Secretary furnished all the needed material to Mr. Weeks. Les would like Mr. Abbie to be called and asked what bonding is possible through his bank. It was agreed to apply for 80,000 with a three to five year payment.

George Cole looked over the bridge in Loverns Mill and found no damage due to Nazers work. Mr. Nazers money is to be release. George has asked if the public service does not remove the tree on Gregg Lake that is hanging over the power lines, can the town crew remove it since it is a danger and he has spoken to the power company several times. Selectmen agreed. L. MacNeil is in favor of sending a bill to the power company. Loverns Mill has all been fixe. Road in good repair after the work of the road crew.

Jim Dennison said he was asked to join the college board but denied to accept. He did find that Florida Inst. would aid N.H. College in obtaining a loan to help with their bills. In effect use Florida Institutes credit rating.
