

Selectmen's Meeting, Monday Aug. 30, 1982

Present: Katherine Ring, Chairman, John Jones, Dave Grossman, of the Messinger and Betty Shaw. Les MacNeil was on vacation

Selectmen met at 7:30, signed checks. Read over Mr. Salmon's permit, signed forms for the Municipal Bond Bank. Looked over Don Mellen and Lloyd Henderson bills. Both bills are to be questioned.

Mr. Duffy met with B. Brown, police chief and the selectmen to discuss a check which was issued to the town for an intent to cut. After much discussion Mr. Duffy agreed to make good on the check within two weeks.

Brian requested permission to purchase a second typewriter so that both officers can do paper work at home when they are free. One typewriter is usually in the office, and it is hard to find time when both are free to do paper work. The selectmen asked how his budget was, and was told in good shape. Permission was granted for an inexpensive typewriter to be purchased.

Four tires have been ordered for the cruiser.

Brian asked for permission to move the old roll top desk that is in the basement into Brian's office. If he can move the desk, and the desk will help him with space, he is free to do so.

At this point he was reminded it wasn't Christmas.

Brian gave a report of duties for his department for the past two weeks.

George Cole, Road Agent has started on Congreeve Road. The rock on Old Carr Rd. will have to be blown out or Town will have to gravel over road in order to correct problem. (Mr. Gregsack has complained about the rock in road)

Culverts in front of Jane Hills' will have to be completed before the sewer phase all account is closed out. K. Ring will call Bob Dodge or Lloyd Thompson from the State Highway Dept. to see when they will get to the job. Concern over the sewer not being completed and closed off was discussed. George Cole has done all that he could to clean up after sewer. It was agreed that problem by Vern Woods is also a Pandelena problem not a town problem.

George will check to see what can be done to correct Mrs. Corsons problem on Main St.

Bill Elliott said when sewer went in, property was never put in order. He was reminded that the property owner is responsible for sewer and water bill. The selectmen will look into condition of his property. to see if it was left in poor condition and if so, see what can be done to correct any problem.

Planning Board approved Buttercup Lane. Lloyd will speak to Mr. Black in regard to extension of road

Selectmen discussed Mr. Salmon's permit. J. Jones does not want to sign the permit K. Ring signed and since Les was on vacation permit was set aside until Mr. Jones can look into the issue. Questions as to the building being non-conforming at this time, septic system, no permit issued or requested in order to re-do the building, are just some of the questions Mr. Jones wants to look into. He feels this permit should go to the B.O.A.

Selectmen agree Don Mellen's bill is high, and K. Ring has agreed to ask for a breakdown of the bill.

Petition came in requesting the voting time be extended to 7pm. Time will be extended to help the working to find a time convenient for them.

Questions on the bond were raised. Amount to be borrowed, length of time for payment and interest rate are all in question. Selectmen want to know if the bond can be paid off early? Papers for the bond will not be signed until the secretary receives answers to the questions. Selectmen are looking into just how much is really needed and how much interest it will cost the town.
