

Selectmen's Meeting, Monday, August 29, 1983

Present: Leslie B. MacNeil, chairman, John J. Jones, Katherine Ring.
Selectmen met at 7:30 signed checks as well as letters.

Questions were raised on the building permits which were applied for.
Selectmen will check out zoning regulations and speak to J. Dennison
to see if permits are eligible.

Reading of last weeks' minutes was waived.

There will be no charge for the filling of a pool.

Town Clock specialists will be called to see if it is possible to have
a timer put on the clock to limit the hours it will strike. A cost
for same will be checked. There has been a written complaint from
a guest at the Inn being kept awake due to the striking of the clock.

Real Keene Gas Co. in for building permit. Business is no longer in
the building and they now wish to have an apartment added to garage.
When original permit was issued, selectmen were told that if the
business did not go, the building would be used for a two car garage.
Two dwellings can not be on the same property, but since there were
other questions to be cleared up the selectmen held ~~the building~~
~~permit~~ to research the regulations. *off answering questions*

George Carlson was in today going over the figures for the final cost
of the sewer project. Additional bonding for the close out was looked
into today. Lloyd Henderson, Town Counsel called Farmers' Home as
well as Municipal Bond Bank for information. Length of time and interest
were questions raised. J. Jones would rather see a loan paid in a short
time, Les MacNeil and K. Ring voted for an additional amount added to the
present bond from Farmers Home or the Bond Bank (whichever will give
the best interest) and to be paid within the next twenty six years, this
would extend the loan while trying to keep the taxes as low as possible.

John Jones to get figures on oil to Municipal Service. Will also check
to see if Rymes will continue with cost plus .04¢.

Mr. McKinney will be called and check into land question at college.
Also check the cost involved to a Town for having someone go out to check
out CUTs in Town.

Complaint as to parking on sidewalks in town.

George Cole, road agent to be asked about the culvert on the property
on Gregg Lake Rd. which Mr. Albrecht agreed to pay some of the cost of
moving same.

George to be asked if he knows who gave permission to put in culvert
across Smith Rd.

Selectmen to follow up on complaint of building going on after BOA
denial.
