

Monday June 18, 1984, Selectmen's Meeting

Selectmen met and called the meeting to order with the Pledge at 7:30pm.
Present: John J. Jones chairman, Katherine M. Ring, and Rachel Reinstein.

Clark Craig, Jr. road agent gave his weekly report. He will need the bill of sale for the new loader in order to have it registered.

Rachel gave Clark a check for the work done by the road crew on the road leading to her property.

Road crew graded Salmon Brook road up to end of the grade V. Clark reported that since the dam had been blown and the beaver moved, he has checked out the road to see if the crew could up-grade the road, or if the owners could up-grade the road. He believes the beaver have started to return to the area of the dam. It is 300 or 400 feet to Mr. Solomons land, and as yet he sees no way of keeping the area clear of the beaver.

Ms. Obert spoke to the selectmen about the damage to her auto. She presented bills to the selectmen, Brian Brown asked to see the bills and he spoke to her and found the damage is the usual repairs due on a second hand auto. "77 Nova". Brian agreed to check out the mechanics who did the repairs and see if they have any of the old parts to see and try to determine if the damage is due to the Road. He will report back to the selectmen next week.

Brian Brown, police chief gave his weekly report. His new officer resigned for personal reasons. Brian will advertise for another officer.

Jim Hammond, road crew, sprained his ankle requiring two visits to the Dr.

K. Ring will speak to Bruce Kierstead to have the upper stairs checked and repair any broken steps. (Outside stairs were reported to be missing)

Mr. Penny and Mr. Pleasant discussed the entrance to the library. They wish to apply for matching funds to install a ramp and have entrance on back side of library along with a parking area. This would have to go to the vote of the Town. Charlie Grabowski asked the selectmen why he has not been appointed to the BOA since he has requested to be. John Jones explained that since Charlie's views on zoning are against any zoning, he would not be able to uphold the regulations. Lloyd Henderson was present during this period of the meeting. Mr. Grabowski had his recorder along with him.

Selectmen decided that when someone applies for a building permit on a class VI road, the selectmen's office will charge a fee of \$11.20 to cover the register of deeds fee and the office will mail out the release form to the register. Permits will be issued prior to mailing, once the office has the forms signed and the check to cover the cost.

Two building permits were signed and one is waiting for the release forms.

Post Office rental agreement was signed and mailed today.

Meeting adjourned at 10:30

Minutes were kept by Katherine M. Ring since Secretary was working as deputy tax collector while tax collector was not able to collect taxes this evening.
