Meeting opened with the Flag Salute, all Selectmen Present.

Mr. Reynolds, Rte 31, was in again about his Current Use. He did not sell his property.

Mr. Rod Zwerner came to discuss replacements on the Conservation Board.

Clark Craig, Road Agent, came and said he had been working on High Street.

The Selectmen voted not to let out Town equipment to lone individuals, as the cost of repairs this year has been terrific.

Donald L. Paige was in to sign his building permit. After much discussion with Town Counsel, Mr. Paige, and Mr. Don Mellon and Selectmen, it was discovered that when Mr Paige got his annexation from the planning board they had joined all his property as one. His deeds were produced by Lloyd Hendersog showing he had separate deeds. One was for the land that he intends to build on. The Selectmen signed the building permit.

Chief Brown came in and gave his report and informed us that he was still having radio problems.

DiBart Lane was discussed. In 1967 the town voted to accept Hilton Ave. and Dibart as a package deal as Roger Hilton would not give Hilton Ave unless

DeBart Lane was accepted too. The lane is a class 6 road. There was not any buildings on the lane until 1978 when James Smith built his house on it. The Subdivision on this road is under discussion with the planning board.
