

Selectmen's Meeting, Monday March 4th, 1985

This evening there was a get together in the upper Town Hall to meet the candidates and hold a budget hearing.

Selectmen called the regular Selectmen's meeting to order at 10:00PM after the above ended.

Checks had been signed during the day.

An intent to cut for Granite State Forestry was signed. The building permit for John Dunlap was set aside until it could be checked out.

Minutes of last week's meeting was accepted.

Selectmen went over the questions raised at the public hearing. Lloyd assured them the proper wording for an article was, "raise and appropriate". Town clerks salary was also correctly worded. If fees were part of the salary it would have had to be worded, so much money plus fees. As it is, all fees are to go back to the Town.

Bob Flanders and Lloyd Henderson met with the Selectmen to talk over the Francis/Chauncy case.

RSA 675:5A states the proper way for the petition to have been signed. All property owners would have had to identify their property.

Since Mr. Flanders is involved in the court case with Mr. & Mrs. Francis, it was agreed the Selectmen along with Mr. Flanders, as Town Moderator, will make the decision as to the acceptability of the petition. An agreement as to the petition being granted or not granted will be made before Town Meeting.

John Jones asked that Lloyd call and notify Mr. & Mrs. Francis' lawyer that many of the signed petitions came in with only one tax number on them and therefore only the number of acres on that tax lot will be counted not all the land owned by the petitioner. The RSA 675:5A clearly states the land must be identified.

Selectmen signed a warrant for the collection of yield tax.

Virginia Alto had written asking about her trailer. A letter is to be sent informing Ms. Alto that two residences can not be on the same property. Ms. Alto has informed the office that electric etc. has been installed to her mobile home making it a residence.
