

Selectmen's Meeting, Monday, July 29, 1985

Present: Katherine M. Ring, chairman, Rachel C. Reinstein and John J. Jones.
Meeting called to order with the Pledge of Allegiance, at 7:30Pm.

Selectmen signed checks as well as building permits for Mr. & Mrs. Nalette, Schultz, Smith/Landry, and Warren.

Minutes of last weeks meeting approved.

Bob Varnum, Road Agent gave his weekly report. No traffic problems on Smith Rd.

Tree Service has taken down many of the trees which involved power lines and telephone lines. Wood left for owner of property in all but two involved.

Bill Gutgesell started work today.

New truck will be picked up Friday. Bob will call office to see insurance is covered.

West St. by Russell property has been filled. Bob will issue a bill to the Sewer & Water for time and material to fill wash out.

The International has a leak in the transmission. Bob will see it is ready for winter. It also needs a U-joint.

The sander will have to be replaced in the near future. One more winter.

The grader will either have to have money put into major repairs or a replacement will have to be made.

Dr. Tenney approved the \$500,000 liability coverage. Bob will check to see how he will make the adjustment.

Mr. R. Edwards submitted another building permit which was approved by the selectmen.

Mr. Grabowski once again asked about the lack of estimates on the Library roof repair. Selectmen have not found any RSA requiring them. Mr. Grabowski will check into this.

Also placed a complaint on the handling of an appeal by the BOA.

Selectmen went over a list of problem roads in the Town. (traffic problems due to poor visibility)

Lloyd Henderson will put a letter together for the Selectmen to sign and send to the Hillsboro Selectmen in regard to the Town line.

Planning Board has asked if set backs are checked on new constructions? The master plan should include an increase in the cost of a building permit. Cost should cover having a building inspector go out to check the site before and during construction.

Selectmen asked both Brian Brown, Police Chief and Lloyd what follow up has taken place on zoning violators. It was agreed that both Lloyd and Brian will follow up on Tuesday since they have not done so.

After reviewing applications for a new officer, it was agreed by the three selectmen and Brian to hire Larry Ashford as the new full time officer. He will start August 12th at a salary of \$17,500.

Selectmen will have to come up with an evacuation plan in the event a damn gives way. A request for a sample plan will be made.

All three selectmen voted to stay with Mr. Don Mellen for the tax map updates.
