

Selectmen's Meeting, Monday, December 2, 1985

Present: Katherine M. Ring, chairman, Rachel C. Reinstein and John J. Jones.

Meeting called to order at 7:30pm. with the Pledge Of Allegiance.

Minutes of last weeks meeting accepted.

Office has been notified that the insurance liability coverage for the Police Dept. has gone up from \$500 to \$1,800 for the year.

Brian Brown gave his weekly report. Gave an update on court findings on violators.

Brian checked out the complaint of open wells and found one owned by Ms. Ziegler and the other was State owned. He has put temp. covers on them.

Both the Police Department and the Highway Department were complimented on the good and speedy work during the storm on Thanksgiving.

Bob Varnum has come to an agreement with Hillsboro as to the care of the road if the BOA approved the sub-division for D. Knapton. Bob's main concern is that the road will still not be accessable from Antrim. In the event of a problem, it would take a long time to get to the road. Selectmen and Bob all share their concern over a safe route for children to get to a bus. D. Knapton has agreed to make the road 21' wide in place of the required 18'. Plowing of the road will be done by Hillsboro and summer maintenance will be the responsibility of Antrim. Bob will salt and sand to the blacktop.

Since there is no way for Mr. Knapton to guarantee there will be no school children for a few years Lloyd has suggested all deeds to the property state the closest pick up for the school bus.

Mr. Dennison requested a letter firming up the agreement for the road by the 19th when there is a hearing by the Planning Board in regard to the sub-division.

Bob would like to see the road go through to the Turnpike but does not see the Town having to pay the amount to cover the cost of opening Mountain Road.

All deeds should also mention the ROW through the discontinued Road. Selectmen will speak to Mark Tenney to see how this will effect the school bus run.

A security bond will be required and the Planning Board must hold compliance hearings after the road is laid out.

Selectmen signed an agreement for the care of Mountain Road.

Mr. Knapton will give 80 acres by Campbell Pund as a gift to the Town.

Selectmen discussed their concern over the loss of the elderly exemption on some of the reassessed property.

All possible violations must be checked out to see if they took place after zoning.

Southwest Reg. Pla. Business was brought up to date by Rachel who attended their last meeting. In the past they have not charged for services to the Towns. Now they may have to charge a fee for any detail work they do. They will supply a fee schedule.
