7:34 Meeting called to order.

The Board reviewed several pieces of information from citizens concerned about the placement of the zoning amendments recommended by the Planning Board on the November ballot, including a petition and an open letter with several signatures (copies attached).

Don Phelps moved to warrant the zoning amendments for the Biennial Town meeting on November 6, 1990. Bill Suydam second. Discussion ensued.

Don Phelps called the question, The vote was as follows: Don Phelps yes, Ed Rowehl yes, Bill Suydam yes, the Zoning Amendment will be on the November ballot by a unanimous vote of the Board.

9:10 Bob Varnum Road Agent, in with monthly report. Mr. Varnum requested executive session to discuss a personnel problem. Don Phelps moved to go into Executive Session per RSA 91a Ed Rowehl seconded. So voted. No information from the Executive Session.

Mr. Varnum completed his report. Tree in the cemetery on Route 31 will be cut up and hauled away. He will review cost of maintaining Breezy Point Road in preparation of signing annual contract, culvert work throughout Town is finished.

9:35 Sgt. Gagnon in with his report. Halloween will be October 31, 5:30pm to 8pm. He asked the Selectmen to go into executive session to discuss an issue of possible litigation. Don Phelps so moved, Ed Rowehl seconded, so voted. No information.

Report of the Mill Pond Improvement Committee was reviewed Don Phelps moved and Ed Rowehl seconded to accept the Committee's recommendation to award the tank bid to Guimond Construction, with the understanding that CAB is the subcontractor. So voted.

Don Phelps moved and Ed Rowehl seconded to abide by the provisions outlined in the Letter of Transmittal to the Water Resources Project Fund Program. Transmittal letter was signed.

Don Phelps moved and Ed Rowehl seconded to pay \$300.00 in dam registration fees under protest. Letter was signed so stating.

The Selectmen signed a letter to the Fire Chief explaining that Antrim is not a participating town in the Water Rescue Assistance Team program.

The Board agreed to make the Old Post Office meeting area available to the Chamber of Commerce.

Ed Rowehl moved to accept the minutes of 10/01/90 as corrected. Don Phelps seconded, so voted. *corrections: insert after "...zoning change on November ballot" Don Phelps moved to warrant the proposed zoning change to the biennial town meeting of Nov. 6, Ed Rowehl seconded. substitute the words "substitute motion" for the word "motion" in the sentence beginning "A move was made by Bill..."*

Discussion of status of the landfill renegotiation request.

Discussion of the closure of the auditorium, normal policy will be followed.

ConVal Selectmen's meeting coming up. Bill Suydam had been appointed, but scheduling problems have arisen. Don Phelps is the new advisory committee appointee.
