Mr. Rymes, of Rymes Heating oil presented a bid for bulk deliveries of gas and diesel to the Town Barn as well as heating oil to all Town Buildings.

\$.035 per gallon above the posted wholesale price (day of delivery), of C.H. Sprague and Son for Diesel fuel and # 2 Heating oil.

\$.035 per gallon above Northeast Petroleum on the day of delivery.

Town responsible for \$.0060 per gallon state discharge tax and \$.0006 per gallon for state pollution tax on all petroleum products.

Mr. Rymes bid is less the Federal and State Tax as he is a major distributor and has a license whereby he is not charged the tax and therefore does not pass on the charge to the Municipality.

J. B. Vaillancourt, Inc. bids for #2 fuel oil and diesel fuel. # 2 fuel oil: Cost NE, \$.9035 + Trans. & delivery cost \$.0415 = \$.9450 per gallon.

Diesel: Cost NE, \$.9385 + Trans. & Delivery \$.0415 = \$.9800 Special Gasoline Cost \$.7905 + Trans. & Delivery \$.0535 + \$.8440 plus tax.

The Vaillancourt bid includes the \$.1600 State tax and the \$.1410 Federal Tax which the Town must submit a request for refunds.

The above quote is subject to increase or decrease as the cost fluctuates.

No decision at this time as to which company will receive the contract.

Intent to Cut for Lot 701 Map 3 (Joseph Inferrera) was signed. Selectmen reviewed the abatement applications. An abatement was granted to a nonresident for inventory penalty.
