Selectmen's Meeting, Monday, August 2, 1993

Present: Philip Dwight, Chairman, Dave Boule', Tom Davis, Betty Shaw, Secretary.

Meeting called to order at 7:00PM.

Tom moved to accept the minutes of the meeting of July 26th as written. Second, Dave. All in favor. So moved.

Selectmen agreed to abate a portion of the yield tax on the Winslow property as the wood cut was of poor quality. Abatement in the amount of \$521.65 was signed.

A yield tax warrant for collection of tax on the Fowler property and one intent to cut on the Kerber property was signed.

Selectmen discussed renting a roll off to accommodate property owners who have old furniture or demolition material to dispose of. A fee schedule to cover the cost of a roll off at the recycling station was established. Sofas \$10, Chairs \$5, Mattresses \$10, rugs \$5, large rugs \$10, Small 4x4 vehicle of furniture \$15, small pickup of furniture \$25. No vehicle larger than a pickup truck will be allowed to dispose of articles. The fees established will be reviewed at a later time to see if they cover the cost of the roll off, adjustments will be made at that time. The supervisor at the recycling station will set fees for miscellaneous articles.

Selectmen discussed possibly opening on Sunday afternoons during the summer months next year. No decision to extend hours have been made at this time.

Selectmen will review the need for a policy to cover conflict of interest.

Selectmen suggested anyone wishing to reserve the tennis court is to sign up on the calendar in the Town Hall.

Selectmen reviewed a request to subdivide the Chicago Cutlery property. Since no formal application was made it is difficult for the Selectmen or the planning board to say a subdivision could be accommodated.

Selectmen will review the applications with Brian Brown, police chief, on Monday, 9 AM. They will schedule interviews for Thursday.

Dennis McKenney discussed intent to cuts and yield taxes. He will develop a fee schedule for the selectmen to review in the event they wish him to oversee intents to cut. He suggested the police and the highway department watch for cuts and licenses while they cruise the town.

The landfill closure was discussed.

Selectmen will meet with the assessors on Wed. at 9AM.

A taxpayer complaint relative to the swap shop was addressed.
