Minutes of the April 10 meeting were approved.

Police Chief Brian Brown reported he had recieved 42 resumes for the new police position. He presented six which he felt should be interviewed. Interviews were to be scheduled for Wednesday evening April 19.

Mr. Sizemore was present and requested a review of his \$75.00 Yield Tax bill as the timber was for his personal use. It was voted to abate the tax.

Peter Moore indicated he would review policy with Doug Tatro at A.R.T.S. and show him the report form N.H.D.E.S. on recycling at other stations in N.H.

The note from the Conservation Commission was reviewed and it was agreed that copies of Intent to Cuts would be put in thier inter-offfice box.

The complaint about the continuing "Yard Sale" on Elm Ave. was discussed. It was agreed that this was in effect a home based business and as such needed the necessary permit. The individual will be so notified.

It was agreed that the cut off for receipt of inventory forms would be April 18 - received in person or postmarked that date.

Phil reported on the status of requests for bids on updating tax maps. He also indicated that he will be starting the assessment pick-up process immediately.
