Board of Selectmen  
Minutes of the March 4, 1996 meeting.

Selectmen present were; Tom Davis, Peter Moore, and Paula Clemente. Also present was Phil Dwight, Business Manager and residents Marion and Tom Winchester.

The meeting opened at 7:00 p.m.

1. The minutes of the February 12th meeting were approved.
2. Approved the following - Intent to Cut in the name of Martha Jennison and Eleanor Lane.
  - Deed in the name of Arthur Cole.
  - Current Use Application of the Harris Center.

Denied the following - Current Use request by the Thomases as the Board did not agree to the "unproductive" classification - would approve if based on a "white pine" classification.

3. Signed the 1996 Line of Credit with Primary Bank.

Reviewed the letter from Department of Environmental Services with relation to Great Brook Dam #00912. Asked that D.E.S. be notified that it is too late to budget this repair in 1996 as letter was received too late. Also, can't really draw down pond in spring.

Reviewed the letter from Department of Transportation re: Gregg Lake Bridge. Didn't feel we could sign a contract with Bettigole until funding is fully committed.

Agreed to release Property Records on data disks for \$75 provided work is done by individual requesting the data.

Noted the information that the Stoddard Selectmen will be perambulating the Stoddard/Antrim Town Line.

Reviewed the 9 request for 1995 abatements. The following four were denied: Maharishi School of Vedic Sciences, William Pierce, Alfred Szlapinski and Mary Davidson. Decisions on the following 5 were delayed to the March 11 meeting; Robert Frazier, David and Jane Corliss, Jane Hill, Marion Noble, and Chris Baker Salmon.

Reviewed two requests for reduction of assessment for 1996. Denied the request on Map 9 lot 238 by Mr. Miller. Will review the CFX request on 9D/650 next week.

Agreed to review the Tax Land Appeal case of New England Timber Realty.

The Selectmen discussed taking a position on Senate Bill 2 re: Conval. No votes were taken.

The Selectmen signed a letter to the Commissioner of Education expressing their deep concern regarding the possibility of withholding State Aid to districts not meeting minimum standards.

The meeting adjourned at 9:30 p.m.
