Brief Explanation: *This year's budget represents a \$20,840 decrease in operational costs but includes the new borrowing costs of \$59,000 for the recently completed water line replacement project for a net increase of \$38,160 or 5.39%. This loss water which historically has been as high as 21% is now at a manageable rate of 12%. This is the measure of the amount of water we treat to what we bill our customers and has a large impact on lowering the cost assessment of plant operations. Rates will increase slightly and yet still be lower than they were in 2009. In FY17 the Joint Water Authority has also authorized a proposed Capital Plan for repairs at the treatment plant. All monies raised come from the Water Enterprise Fund.*

Brief Explanation: *This year's budget for the third year in a row has decreased by \$17,632 or 2.02%. Gardner is looking to make some improvements/upgrades in the sewer system which will bring a series of rate increases to cover the costs. It is projected that we will see this*

affect over the next four to five years. Although the budget has decreased this is the first year where the debt payments (\$279,260) are not offset by user assessment fees. This results in the revenue being raised by increased rates. In FY17 the rate will move to \$16.50 per hundred cubic feet. What this means to the rate payers is that they will be paying \$16.50 for every 748 gallons that they generate. Over the last 11 years this will mean an average of 1.9% per year. On the positive side, this debt payment's last year will be in 2019.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate by borrowing or otherwise, an amount not to exceed \$7,884,127 to be used for the design, construction and related costs associated with the construction of a new Department of Public Works (70%), Water (18%) and Sewer (12%) facility, and that to meet this appropriation, the Treasurer with the approval of the Board of Selectmen, be authorized to borrow a sum of money and to issue bonds or notes thereof under Chapter 44, Section 8, of the General Laws, or general authority; that such bonds or notes shall be general obligations of the Town and notes and charges shall be so established as to provide sufficient funds to ensure that the entire principal and interest payable on any borrowing associated with this project will be assessed to the users of the facility; that the Board of Selectmen be authorized to apply for, accept and expend, federal or state aid for the project, that the Treasurer, with approval of the Board of Selectmen, is authorized to borrow all or a portion of such amount from the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), and otherwise to contract with the USDA with respect to any such loan; and that the Board of Selectmen is authorized to expend all funds available from the project and to take other action necessary to carry out this project; including but not limited to entering into any and all contracts on such terms and conditions as are in the best interest of the Town; provided, however, that the Board of Selectmen has determined that grants or other financial assistance are available from the Federal Government, the Commonwealth or any other source, which in the aggregate, will provide for the project costs, provided that no bonds or notes shall be issued unless the Town has voted at an election to exempt this expenditure from the provisions of Proposition 2½, so called, or act in relation thereto. *(Requested by the Town Administrator)*

This facility will be built to meet all current state and local guidelines. Funding for the project will be supported proportionally with funds from the Town of 70%, Water (18%), and Sewer (12%) departments. It is currently estimated that the portion of the facility paid for by the Water & Sewer departments will obtain a 20% grant award from the USDA.*

To see if the Town will vote to acquire, by purchase, eminent domain or otherwise as provided by the General Laws a parcel of land located at Williams and Turnpike Roads consisting of 17 acres, being the same land shown on Assessors Map 20, Parcel 51, for Ashburnham Municipal Light Plant (AMLPL) purposes, any and all costs and expenses, including but not limited to any damages awarded, attorneys’ fees, and engineering fees, associated with said acquisition to be paid by AMLP, or act in relation thereto. *(Requested by the Light Board.)*

Brief Explanation: *The Ashburnham Municipal Light Plant wishes to purchase the parcel of land that is immediately across Turnpike Road from the existing electrical substation which is owned by National Grid. AMLP currently uses this substation under a 30 year joint use agreement that was signed in 1996 and will be renegotiated in approximately nine years. There are a number of possible uses for this parcel of land, including as a potential location for grid battery storage (photovoltaic solar) within our system. It is also a possible site to relocate our substation equipment if for any reason we can’t negotiate a favorable joint use agreement renewal. The funding for this purchase will come entirely from AMLP monies, and no taxpayer funds will be used towards this purchase.*

Article 15 Voted: On motion of Mark Carlisle, it was voted to acquire, by purchase, eminent domain or otherwise as provided by the General Laws a parcel of land located at Williams and Turnpike Roads consisting of 17 acres for Light Department purposes.

Section 8: In accordance with the provisions of G.L., c. 60, Section 62A, the Treasurer is hereby authorized to enter into payment agreements with persons entitled to redeem parcels in tax title subject to the following terms and provisions; such agreements shall be for a maximum term of not more than five years and may waive not more than 50 per cent of the interest that has accrued on the tax title amount. *(Requested by the Citizen petition)*

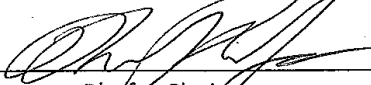

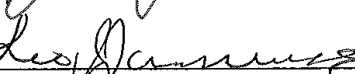
