The meeting of the Auburn City Council was called to order at 6:00PM in the City Council Chambers 24 South St. Auburn NY by Mayor Quill.

1. Roll Call – The Deputy City Clerk called the roll. Councilors McCormick, Camardo, Cuddy, and Ruzicka, and Mayor Quill were all present.

4. Public Announcements –

The Deputy City Clerk read the following announcements:

- A. The next meeting of the City of Auburn Planning Board will be held on Tuesday, December 1, 2015 at 6:30 p.m. This meeting will be held at Memorial City Hall, Council Chambers, 24 South Street, Auburn, NY 13021.
- B. The City of Auburn will be holding a public meeting for the Community Development Block Grant five year strategic plan. Residents may help shape the future of our community by attending the 2016-2017 Community Development Block Grant Program PUBLIC HEARING to be held on December 8, 2015, 10:00AM-12:00 Noon. she received a bill from the City for \$2,000.00 for a water leak that occurred in front of her house. The Corporation Counsel John Rossi stated he would call Mr. Chick to discuss the matter.

8. Reports of City Officials

A. City Manager's Report

- The New York State Department of Transportation has notified the City that temporary support work to stabilize the N. Division Street bridge will be necessary to keep the bridge operational until the bridge is replaced 18 months from now. The City estimates such stabilization could cost between \$30,000.00 and \$50,000.00. The Manager will update the Council in the future as more information is obtained.
- There have been charges on the most recent claims list to pay.gov, these are fees associated with mandates of the Affordable Care Act.

B. Reports from members of Council

• Council McCormick reported that she discovered upon a visit to the Upstate hospital in Syracuse that the hospital features in its lobby a beautiful mural of Auburn's Hoopes Park.

B. Ordinances – The Deputy City Clerk read the first reading of: ORDINANCE # 7 OF 2015 - AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF AUBURN, NEW YORK

To be considered by the City Council at the December 3, 2015 City Council meeting.

WHEREAS, Chapter 305 of the Auburn Code, entitled Zoning, has been adopted by the Auburn City Council; and

WHEREAS, Article XIII, entitled Zoning Map, §305-94, entitled Purpose, states that this article was intended to establish zoning districts created by this chapter on a map of the City of Auburn to be known as the "Zoning Map of the City of Auburn"; and

WHEREAS, the zoning districts are established pursuant to §305, and districts are defined and enumerated; and

WHEREAS, ESBD Property, LLC owns a parcel of real property situated at 50-60 Wallace Avenue in the City of Auburn, New York; and

WHEREAS, 50-60 Wallace Avenue is in an I: General Industrial zone and the current residential use portion of said properties is a pre-existing, non-conformity within the zone; and

WHEREAS, the petitioner requests that the Council amend the Zoning Map of the City of Auburn such that a portion of 50-60 Wallace Avenue, as shown on attached Exhibit A2, be rezoned R-2: Single-, Two-, and Multiple-Family Residential; and WHEREAS, said review of the above action has been made in full compliance with Article 8 of the New York Conservation Law and the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), and the City of Auburn Planning Board, acting as Lead Agency in said SEQRA review, has determined to prepare a Negative Declaration under SEQRA for the proposed action. NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED that the City Council of the City of Auburn, New York does hereby amend the Zoning Map of the City of Auburn whereby a portion of the lands situated at 50-60 Wallace Avenue and shown on "Exhibit A2," which is attached hereto and

made part thereof, shall be classified as R-2: Single-, Two-, and Multiple-Family Residential rather than I: General Industrial, in order that these lands be consistent with the present and

historical use and the residential zoning of the adjacent area.

Mayor Quill announced that Saturday night, November 28th is the Holiday Parade in Downtown Auburn beginning at 6 p.m.

Executive Session. Councilor Cuddy made a motion to enter Executive Session, seconded by Councilor Camardo. Council voted to enter an executive session regarding the following matters:

The motion to enter executive session carried 5-0. Councilors McCormick, Camardo, Cuddy, Ruzicka, and Mayor Quill all voting aye. The Council entered Executive Session at 6:16 p.m. Executive session adjourned at 6:46 p.m.
