APPOINTING A MARRIAGE OFFICER

WHEREAS, Section 11-c of the New York State Domestic Relations Law empowers the governing body of a City to appoint one or more Marriage Officers who shall have the authority to solemnize a marriage in accordance with other provisions of the New York State Domestic Relations Law; and

WHEREAS, the number of marriage officers appointed for a municipality is determined by the governing body and Marriage Officers must be eighteen (18) years of age or older, reside in the municipality and have the authority to solemnize the marriage within the territory of the municipality which makes the appointment; and

WHEREAS, it is requested that Guy Thomas Cosentino, former Mayor of the City of Auburn, receive this appointment in to solemnize a marriage in the City of Auburn on Saturday, October 1, 2016.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Guy Thomas Cosentino is hereby appointed as a Marriage Officer pursuant to the New York State Domestic Relations Law, Section 11-c and that he shall have the authority to solemnize marriages within the City of Auburn; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this appointment shall be effective for the date of October 1, 2016.

F. Staff/Vendor Presentations

F1. Owasco Lake Water Quality Update. Eileen O'Connor, Director of the Cayuga County Health Department spoke pertaining to recent water supply testing due to the outbreak of blue-green algal blooms in Owasco Lake. The City of Auburn and the Town of Owasco water supply have been tested on a regular basis for the past week by the Health Department. She discussed the value of water to individuals and a community. She presented the Council with a brochure that her office uses to educate the public on the importance of water.

The Owasco Lake Watershed Inspection Program Harmful Algal Bloom Monitoring Program tracks and reports the development of harmful algal blooms on Owasco Lake. Owasco Lake is the source of public water supply for public water users supplied by the City of Auburn and the Town of Owasco. The City of Auburn provides public water to residents in the City of Auburn, the Towns of Aurelius, Fleming Water District 6, Throop, Mentz, Brutus, Montezuma, Sennett, Springport Water District 2, and the Villages of Port Byron, Weedsport, and Cayuga. The Town of Owasco provides public water to residents in the Town of Owasco and Town of Fleming Water District.

The Cayuga County Health Department collects untreated and treated water samples from the City of Auburn and Town of Owasco's water treatment plants to monitor for toxins associated with blue-green algae. - F2. Auburn Parks Master Plan Final Presentation. Maren King professor from the State University of New York College of Environmental Science and Forestry (SUNY ESF) and graduate students presented to the Council the final proposal of a Parks master Plan for the City parks. The plan had been compiled over the past 9 months with a series of community meetings held to gather public input. The graduate students also did a comprehensive survey of City park and playground conditions and presented a catalogue of the existing conditions in the master plan. The Council will be asked to formally adopt the master plan at a future Council meeting and the document will be used for future City capital planning. Christina Selvek, Director of Capital Improvement Program and grants for the City also spoke pertaining to work currently being done at the Clifford Field Clubhouse. She also described Clifford Field improvements that will be conducted over the next three years which total approximately \$500,000.00 worth of upgrades.
- F3. Presentation on the Municipal Cooperation Agreement with the Cayuga County Health Insurance Consortium by Laura Wills, City Comptroller. Ms. Wills presented to the Council on the process and reasons for considering joining the Cayuga County Health Insurance Consortium. The Council will be asked to adopt a municipal cooperation agreement at a future Council meeting.
