FINANCIAL RESOLUTION #157 OF 2016

AUTHORIZING A WATER FUND TRANSFER FOR WATER FILTRATION PLANT MICROCYSTIN TREATMENT AND WATER QUALITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

WHEREAS, On September 26, 2016, the City of Auburn observed detectable levels of toxins associated with harmful blue green algae blooms in the raw and finished (treated) water and as a result of this detection, it is necessary to develop a full-scale design report to study multiple physical and chemical treatment options at the City's Water Filtration Plant; and,

WHEREAS, the design report will consider multiple treatment options, estimated construction costs and provide final recommendations in accordance with New York State Department of Health, so that the City can effectively treat the toxins associated with the harmful algae blooms in Owasco Lake; and,

WHEREAS, in addition to treatment options, the report will consider the costs associated with extending a new intake deeper into Owasco Lake, alternate supply sources and improvements to cross connection points with the Towns of Owasco and Fleming to provide a redundant source of water for the City of Auburn and customers in Cayuga County; and,

WHEREAS, a formal funding request will be sent to the State of New York and/or the Federal Government in order that the City be fully reimbursed for the costs associated with the report and the construction costs associated with the implementation of the report's findings; and

WHEREAS, special legislation will be required by the State of New York to allow the City to complete the recommendations of the report using the Design Build construction model that has been used by various State agencies; and

WHEREAS, it will be necessary for the Mayor and Council to formally request the City's State Legislators to enact special legislation for the City to participate in the Design Build procurement model in order that the recommendations and treatment upgrades be implemented to be fully functional by the end of July, 2017, in preparation for the late summer harmful algae blooms that seasonally occur in Owasco Lake; and

WHEREAS, the City will engage the services of a professional consulting firm to conduct the study and fund the initial phase of the project scoping and design review and it will be necessary that the City initially be responsible for this cost in the amount of \$75,000 to be transferred from the Water Fund to the Water Capital Fund Account #HF8330 440 IH.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Auburn City Council does hereby approve a transfer in the amount of \$75,000 from the Water Fund to the Water Capital Fund Account #HF8330 440 IH to fund a design report required by the New York State Department of Health to treat the toxins associated with the seasonal harmful algae blooms in Owasco Lake; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this transfer be completed immediately upon approval of this Resolution.
