8. Reports of City Officials

A. City Manager's Report

- The lease agreement for ice at Casey Park between the Auburn Hockey Boosters and the City has not been finalized as we had anticipated. At this point we are working out provisions to protect the city from the financial impact of a major equipment failure. We met with the Boosters again today and I'm confident we have identified a way we can meet the needs of both the City and the Boosters. The language in the contract will have to be modified to accommodate those changes and therefore Corporation Counsel has recommended we draft a new resolution for Council's consideration in the coming weeks.
- There was a meeting this week to kick off the redevelopment of the State St parcel commonly known as the Kalet site. Our consultant will be setting up meeting with adjacent property owners/occupants and a couple of public comment meetings as well. As soon as we have those dates we will update the community on time and location. The kick off meeting also covered the topic of environmental review, again as the project moves forward we will update Council and the public on what to expect as well as the results.
- The City's annual audit will be kicking off on Monday and will continue for approximately two weeks.
- Staff is examining some vehicle and parking changes that may be proposed due to the Owasco River Trail project. Those proposed changes will be presented to Council soon and will most likely be combined with changes to Genesee St parking and last week's changes involving vehicles and traffic as they all are part of the same section of local law and need to follow the same process.
- Our Powder Activated Carbon or PAC system has been up and running and performing
 well. Our city staff as well as the engineering consultants from GHD, NYS DEC, and our
 local Department of Health have been monitoring and adjusting both the equipment and
 the process. Our finished water remains high quality with no detectable microcystins. All
 of the involved agencies have been in close communication to successfully implement the
 new process.

B. Reports from members of Council

• Councilor Cuddy discussed a recent meeting of the Auburn Industrial Development Authority that he attended and that it was announced that the Automatic Rolls factory in Auburn had just obtained a major contract with a major fast food company that was positive news for the company.

- Councilor Giannettino discussed a recent meeting he had with the new director of the East Hill Family Medical. He also discussed a movie documentary that has been made by the State OASIS program about the opioid epidemic titled "Reversing the Stigma" that will be shown the evening of September 21st and 28th at the Auburn Public Theater.
- Councilor Carabajal discussed the ribbon cutting event that was held bt the Auburn School District to celebrate the new turf field installed at Holland Stadium at the Auburn Junior High School. She discussed the economic impact the new facility would have for our City.
- Councilor McCormick congratulated the Auburn School District on the successful turf installation at Holland Stadium.

FINANCIAL RESOLUTION # 137 OF 2017

AUTHORIING A FINAL LUMP SUM REPAYMENT FOR THE FYE 2015 POLICE AND FIRE PENSION AMORTIZATION

WHEREAS, the City amortized pension costs for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2015, for the police and fire retirement systems, and

WHEREAS, the City's unaudited results show that the general fund has a surplus for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2017, and

WHEREAS, the City, in an effort to reduce debt and interest costs desires to make a final lump sum repayment in the amount of \$240,000 against the 2015 amortization amount which will result in a lifetime savings of interest of approximately \$27,000 and reduce annual payments by approximately \$32,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Auburn City Council does hereby authorize an increase to the police (A3120.802) and fire (A3410.803) retirement expenditures for fiscal 2017 in the amount of \$120,000 each for a total of \$240,000 to make a lump sum repayment of the 2015 amortization.

FINANCIAL RESOLUTION #138 OF 2017

AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFER OF FUNDS TO THE WEST GENESEE STREET PAVEMENT PRESERVATION PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Auburn City Council will be voting on Award Resolution #139 of 2017, which will authorize the Mayor to execute a change order of \$85,000 to C&S Engineers for design for the West Genesee Street Pavement Preservation Project; and,

WHEREAS, there is currently not sufficient funding available in the project agreement with NYS Department of Transportation and therefore City Council must authorize an increase in the budget and a transfer of funds from the General fund to the Capital fund in the amount of \$85,000; and,

WHEREAS, the change order is considered an eligible cost and will be submitted to the NYS Department of Transportation for increased federal highway and NYS Marchiselli aid allocation; and,

WHEREAS, typical federal highway aid allocations are 80% of eligible costs and typical NYS Marchiselli aid allocations are up to 15% of eligible costs; and,

WHEREAS, should additional allocations of federal or State funds be awarded the General fund shall be reimbursed for amounts in excess of the required local share; and,

WHEREAS, there is a sufficient amount budgeted in the General fund for Transfers to the Capital Fund to cover the increase in the budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Auburn City Council does hereby authorize an \$85,000 increase in the West Genesee Pavement Preservation capital account #HA5110-440-HN funded through a transfer from the General fund Transfer to Capital Account #A9812.904.

AUTHORIZING CHANGE ORDER NO. 1 TO THE ENGINEERING AND DESIGN SERVICES CONTRACT FOR W. GENESEE STREET PAVEMENT PRESERVATION PROJECT- PIN 375601

WHEREAS, on July 17, 2014, the Auburn City Council passed Agreement Resolution No. 128 of 2014, which authorized the Master Agreement and funding of Design Phases I-VI of the W. Genesee Street Pavement Preservation project, and;

WHEREAS, this Project is a Locally Administered Federal Aid Project and is reimbursed 80% by the Federal Highway Administration and 15% New York State Marchiselli funds and a local city match requirement of 5%; and

WHEREAS, on October 16, 2014, the City of Auburn City Council awarded the design contract for this project to C&S Engineers by Award Resolution No. 158 of 2014; and,

WHEREAS, due to additional engineering design services that were provided beyond the original scope of this project, such as the increased length of the project, the inclusion of some additional traffic signal improvements, the additional utility work throughout the project limits, and the compliance with the new ADA sidewalk standards, the City of Auburn now needs to authorize Change Order No.1 to C&S Engineers Inc. in the amount of \$85,000 for this project. This award is contingent upon approval by NYSDOT.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Auburn does hereby approve Change Order No. 1, authorizing the engineering and design services contract for the W. Genesee Street Pavement Preservation Project to C&S Engineers, Inc. in the amount of \$85,000; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the cost of the Change Order No. 1 for the engineering and design services contract is to be charged to the West Genesee Street Pavement Project Account #HA 5110-440-HN; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the cost of the construction inspection services contract is to be charged to the West Genesee Street Pavement Project Account #HA 5110-440-HN; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor of the City of Auburn is hereby authorized to execute any and all necessary agreements and contracts, certifications, and reimbursement requests for Federal Aid and/ or State-Aid on behalf of the City of Auburn with the New York State Department of Transportation in connection with the advancement or approval of the Project and providing for the administration of the Project and the municipality's first-instance funding of Project costs and permanent funding of the local share of Federal-aid and State-aid-eligible Project costs and all Project costs within appropriations therefore that are not so eligible; and,

AGREEMENT RESOLUTION #141 OF 2017

APPROVING A LEASE AGREEMENT WITH THE AUBURN HOCKEY BOOSTERS CLUB FOR THE OPERATION OF CASEY PARK ICE RINK

September 21, 2017

WHEREAS, on September 9, 2015, the City of Auburn, hereinafter referred to as the "City" and the Auburn Hockey Boosters Club, hereinafter referred to as "Boosters", entered into an agreement whereby the Boosters leased the Casey Park Ice Rink from the City; and

WHEREAS, the term of this original agreement is now expired; and

WHEREAS, the Boosters have requested that the City renew the lease agreement; and

WHEREAS, the City would like to continue to provide a financially sustainable operation for the Casey Park Ice Rink; and

WHEREAS, the renewal agreement proposes a one-year term commencing on October 1, 2017, and ending on March 1, 2017, with a lease payment to be made by the Boosters to the City in the amount \$20,000 to be paid in two equal installments, the first being made on December 1, 2017, and the second being made on April 1, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the renewal agreement requires that the Boosters continue to pay for all manpower services and support for equipment setup, ice installation, operation, programming, maintenance, end-of-season shutdown and ice removal at the Casey Park Ice Rink that exceeds a specified amount; and

WHEREAS, the renewal agreement states that the City has reserved the right to immediate terminate the contract in the event that any equipment necessary for the ice or maintenance thereof ceases to operate properly.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Auburn City Council does hereby approve a Lease Agreement by and between the City of Auburn and the Auburn Hockey Boosters for the operation of Casey Park Ice Rink for a one-year term commencing on October 1, 2017, and ending on March 1, 2018, with a lease payment of \$20,000 to be made in two equal installments to the Casey Park Special Revenue Fund Revenue Account CI99.2770.ICE; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auburn City Council hereby authorizes the Mayor, or appointed designee, to duly execute the Lease Agreement.

Note: Agreement Resolution 141 of 2017 was not considered by the Council at the recommendation of the City Manager. The City Manager will work on matters pertaining to this this resolution and bring it back to the Council at a future Council meeting.

AGREEMENT RESOLUTION #143 OF 2017

AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH CAYUGA COMMUNITY COLLEGE TO LEASE FALCON PARK FOR THEIR MEN'S BASEBALL PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the City of Auburn is the owner of a baseball stadium known as Falcon Park which is used primarily by a Minor League professional baseball team known as the Auburn Doubledays; and

WHEREAS, Cayuga Community College is organizing a Men's Baseball Team to begin play in the 2019 collegiate baseball season and needs a facility to conduct this program for practices and games, and the College does not have a baseball field at its campus; and

WHEREAS, the College and City have conducted extensive discussions for the utilization of Falcon Park for the College Men's Baseball Team and the parties have agreed to enter into a lease

agreement for an initial terms of two years, beginning March 1 through May 30th each year with an option for the College to renew for five additional two-year terms at an annual rental of \$7,000 per year; and

WHEREAS, the agreement will allow the City and College to cooperatively share a municipal asset which such program is advocated by the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Auburn City Council to approve this agreement, which is attached hereto, and to authorize the Mayor to sign the agreement whereby the City will lease Falcon Park to the College for use by its Men's Baseball Team beginning in the year 2019.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Auburn City Council does hereby approve an agreement between the City of Auburn and Cayuga Community College allowing the College to lease Falcon Park for the use of the College Men's Baseball Team pursuant to the terms of the agreement between the parties which is attached to this Resolution, and the Mayor is authorized to sign the agreement on behalf of the City.
