# 8. Reports of City Officials

# A. City Manager's Report

- Corporation Counsel and I have been working with City Court and the NYS Office of Court Administration (OCA) for quite some time regarding the need for expanded City Court space. This discussion actually goes back approximately two to three years. The space that is currently potentially available within the current facility (old Post Office) is not an adequate long term solution according to OCA. We have explored some other vacant office space downtown and they are also not acceptable to OCA. We are exploring the feasibility of working court space back into the plan for a new public safety facility. We will continue to work on this and will keep you informed.
- The Gazebo across from City Hall was removed this week as the first step in the process of preparing the site for the construction of the new Equal Rights Heritage Center. The gazebo was originally installed as a gift from City employees to the City in 1992-1993 as part of the Auburn Bicentennial celebration, making it 25 years old. About 15 years ago the City did some significant structural repairs to it. We originally had intended to attempt to salvage the structure so that it could be relocated to and reinstalled at another City park. Upon mobilizing to take the structure down City crews determined that the materials of the structure had weathered to the point that it would not be possible to salvage or relocate.
- The Christmas Tree that was located in the gazebo has been relocated to the front of the Auburn Police and Fire Station.

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Auburn, New York (the "City") is considering approving the purchase of equipment including two motor vehicles used for fighting fires and apparatus used in connection with such motor vehicles (the "Project"); and

**WHEREAS**, the City desires to comply with New York State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQR") and the regulations adopted pursuant thereto by the Department of Environmental Conservation of the State of New York, being 6 NYCRR Part 617, as amended (the "Regulations") with respect to the Project; and

**WHEREAS,** the Project is not subject to review under SEQRA since it involves the purchase of equipment, which is listed as a "Type II Action" under 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c)(25).

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City Council of the City of Auburn declares that the Project constitutes a "Type II Action" under 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c)(25) and that no further action under the SEQR Act and the Regulations is required; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that this resolution shall take effect immediately.

## **BOND ORDINANCE #4 OF 2017**

BOND ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF AUBURN, NEW YORK, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,800,000 SERIAL BONDS TO FINANCE THE PURCHASE OF MOTOR VEHICLES USED FOR FIGHTING FIRES

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Auburn, New York as follows:

- <u>Section 1</u>. The City of Auburn, New York (the "City") is hereby authorized to purchase two motor vehicles used for fighting fires, including apparatus used in connection with such motor vehicle, at an estimated maximum cost of \$1,800,000.
- Section 2. It is hereby determined that the maximum estimated cost of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is \$1,800,000, said amount is hereby appropriated therefore and the plan for the financing thereof shall consist of the issuance of \$1,800,000 in serial bonds (the "Bonds") of the City authorized to be issued pursuant to this Ordinance.
- Section 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is twenty (20) years pursuant to paragraph 27 of Section 11.00(a) of the Local Finance Law.
- Section 4. Pursuant to Section 107.00(d)(9) of the Local Finance Law, current funds are not required to be provided prior to issuance of the Bonds or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of issuance of the Bonds.
- Section 5. The temporary use of available funds of the City, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were borrowed, raised or otherwise created, is hereby authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Local Finance Law, for the capital purposes described in Section 1 of this Ordinance.
- Section 6. The Bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds, shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and the Bonds, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds, shall be general obligations of the City, payable as to both principal and interest by a general tax upon all the real property within the City without legal or constitutional limitation as to rate or amount. The faith and credit of the City are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds, and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the City by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the Bonds and bond anticipation notes to mature in such year, and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.
- Section 7. Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance and of the Local Finance Law, and pursuant to the provisions of Sections 21.00, 30.00, 50.00 and 56.00 to 63.00, inclusive, of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the Bonds herein authorized,

including renewals of such notes, and the power to prescribe the terms, form and contents of the Bonds, and any bond anticipation notes, and the power to sell and deliver the Bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds, and the power to issue bonds providing for level or substantially level or declining annual debt service, is hereby delegated to the City Comptroller, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the City.

Section 8. The reasonably expected source of funds to be used to initially pay for the expenditures authorized by Section 1 of this Ordinance shall be from the City's General Fund. It is intended that the City shall then reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of the Bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized by this Ordinance and that the interest payable on the Bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds shall be excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes. This Ordinance is intended to constitute the declaration of the City's "official intent" to reimburse the expenditures authorized by this Ordinance with the proceeds of the Bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized herein, as required by Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this Ordinance, no moneys are reasonably expected to be, received, allocated on a long term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the objects or purposes described herein.

Section 9. The serial bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized to be issued by this Ordinance are hereby authorized to be consolidated, at the option of the City's Comptroller, the Chief Fiscal Officer, with the serial bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized by other bond ordinances previously or heretofore adopted by the City Council for purposes of sale in to one or more bond or note issues aggregating an amount not to exceed the amount authorized in such ordinances. All matters regarding the sale of the bonds, including the dated date of the bonds, the consolidation of the serial bonds and the bond anticipation notes with other issues of the City and the serial maturities of the bonds are hereby delegated to the City Comptroller, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the City.

- Section 10. The validity of the Bonds authorized by this Ordinance and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds may be contested only if:
  - (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the City is not authorized to expend money; or
  - (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this Ordinance or a summary hereof are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication; or
  - (c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

<u>Section 11</u>. The City Comptroller, as Chief Fiscal Officer of the City, is hereby authorized to enter into an undertaking for the benefit of the holders of the Bonds from time to time, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of the Bonds, requiring

the City to provide secondary market disclosure as required by Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12.

Section 12. This Ordinance, or a summary of this Ordinance, shall be published in the official newspapers of the City for such purpose, together with a notice of the Clerk of the City in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 13. This Ordinance is not subject to a mandatory or permissive referendum.

Section 14. The Council hereby determines that the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act and the regulations thereunder have previously been satisfied with respect to the expenditures authorized by this Ordinance.

<u>Section 15</u>. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

#### FINANCIAL RESOLUTION #172 OF 2017

# AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFER OF WATER FUNDS FOR THE WATER FILTRATION PLANT EFFLUENT SYSTEM AND FACILLITY UPGRADES

**WHEREAS,** on October 27, 2016, the Auburn City Council passed Financial Resolution #157 of 2016 authorizing a \$75,000 water fund transfer to immediately fund an Engineering Assessment to review and study multiple treatment alternatives for Auburn to best treat toxins associated with harmful algal blooms; and,

- **WHEREAS**, on January 26, 2017, the City accepted \$75,000 in grant funding from the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation, completely offsetting this fund transfer; and.
- **WHEREAS**, on April 27, 2017, the Auburn City Council passed Financial Resolution #61 of 2017 authorizing an additional \$600,000 water fund transfer to immediately fund the implementation of the Water Filtration Plant Microcystin Treatment and Water Quality Improvement Project; and,
- **WHEREAS**, on June 1, 2017, the City accepted \$600,000 in grant funding from the NYSEFC, completely offsetting the second fund transfer; and,
- **WHEREAS**, as a result of the aforementioned expedited funding process, the Microcystin treatment system was fully integrated and successfully functioning as a new component of the water filtration plant treatment process by August of 2017; and,
- **WHEREAS**, on August 20, 2017, within the initial week of full time operation of the new system, City officials and its engineering support staff discovered the filtration plant's effluent treatment system, the Lagoon, was not operating as originally designed; and,
- **WHEREAS**, The Lagoon is currently permitted by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) to treat effluent; or, byproduct from the sedimentation tank and all backwash filter water, resulting from the water filtration process; and,
- **WHEREAS**, upon discovery of the compromised lagoon condition, this process was immediately bypassed and temporarily retired as an effluent treatment system and a diversion was installed to direct effluent flow to the existing sanitary sewer system instead of through the Lagoon; and,
- WHEREAS, after close coordination with the New York State Department of Health and NYSDEC is has been determined that the Lagoon requires maintenance and cleaning to restore its original treatment volume in the immediate future; and,
- WHEREAS, it is necessary to transfer funds to position the City to take immediate and necessary steps towards properly maintaining and upgrading the existing Lagoon, satisfying all stipulations and requirements outlined by the NYSDEC, and in accordance with the City's existing State Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (SPDES) Permit; and,
- **WHEREAS**, any unused funds resulting from the transfer for the Water Filtration Plant Effluent System and Facility Upgrades project shall be returned to the Water Fund; and,
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Auburn City Council does hereby authorize a \$675,000 transfer from the capital account entitled Water Filtration Plant Microcystin Treatment and Water Quality Improvement Project (HF 8330 440 IH) to capital account entitled Water Filtration Plant Effluent System and Facility Upgrades (HF 8330 440 JC).

# AUTHORIZING AN APPLICATION TO THE 2017 RESTORE NY COMMUNITIES INITIATIVE FOR THE SCHINES THEATER

**WHEREAS,** the City of Auburn prepared and submitted a Downtown Revitalization Initiative (DRI) application to New York State in 2017; and

**WHEREAS,** the City included the Schines Theater in the DRI application, which will be a transformative project that develops and enhances the facility in a manner that will attract and retain residents, visitors, businesses and employment opportunities; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Auburn desires to pursue alternative funding sources to move this project forward; and

**WHEREAS,** Empire State Development (ESD) has released a Request for Funding Proposals for 2017 Restore NY Communities Initiative projects for which municipalities are eligible to apply; and

**WHEREAS,** the Schines Theater project aligns with the City of Auburn's Comprehensive Plan, *Building a Sustainable Auburn*, in the following areas:

# **Boosting Downtown**

Goal 1: Enhance Downtown as a walkable, vibrant urban place

• Strategy D3 – Continue supporting and funding the rehabilitation of historic buildings using city, state and federal dollars

Goal 4: Develop downtown Auburn as a center for arts and entertainment

• Strategy D14 – Market the downtown area as one suitable for arts and trades, as well as a great place to live.

# Revitalizing Neighborhoods

Goal 2: Encourage environmentally friendly homes and neighborhoods

• Strategy N12 – Encourage the reuse of existing historic buildings

### Shaping Business Grown Across Auburn

Goal 1: Encourage sustainable development principles in the creation of new commercial parcels and buildings, as well as in the renovation of existing commercial parcels and buildings

• Strategy B5 – Identify important vacant and industrial sites around the city and encourage their reintegration into Auburn's economy.

## Simplifying and Improving Development

• Strategy S9 – Secure resources for the protection of historic and cultural resources; and

**WHEREAS,** the Phase I rehabilitation for the Schines Theater has an anticipated cost of \$6,000,000, which is appropriate for this project, and facilitates effective and efficient use of existing and future public resources so as to promote both economic development and preservation of community resources; and

**WHEREAS,** the City of Auburn is requesting \$1,000,000 in funding assistance from the Restore NY Communities Initiatives program; and

WHEREAS, Schines Theater LLC will make available the required application and commitment fees; and

**WHEREAS,** the City of Auburn and Schines Theater LLC do not currently have the funding to pay for 100% of the rehabilitation for the Schines Theater, and it is necessary to obtain New York State funding assistance for the rehabilitation.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Auburn, New York:

- 1. That the Mayor, or appointed designee, is authorized to submit an application for funding under the 2017 Restore NY Communities Initiative to assist the Schines Theater rehabilitation project in an amount estimated at \$6,000,000 in total project costs; and
- 2. That the City of Auburn is requesting \$1,000,000 in funding assistance from the Empire State Development Restore NY Communities Initiative, with Schines Theater LLC making available the required application and commitment fees; and
- 3. That the Mayor, or appointed designee, is also authorized, if awarded, to execute the grant assistance contract, submit project documentation, and otherwise act for the Municipality's governing body in all matters related to the project and state assistance; and
- 4. That the City Comptroller is authorized to recognize grant revenue, if awarded, and to appropriate the funds into the designated departmental or capital account(s).
