o General Discussion

- o BM Led a discussion of the upcoming meeting schedule.
- o BM-Jim Fay will be presenting a report on his recent visit to Trinity developments at the 1/11 FinCom meeting.

o Review of the Parks Department Budget

- JT- Our mowers are failing. Keeping them running is an ongoing problem when you're trying to cut the budget. What is the best way to pursue a new mover?
- SH-The minimum for a capital purchase is \$10K. Assets cannot be combined (to meet the \$10K threshold).
- o LG-We may be able to use the capital stabilization fund.
- SH-Who can release fund from capital stabilization?
- LG-Town meeting. We should look at spending some of this fund each year subject to annual limits.
- O SH-We may be at the point where it's time to tap the rainy day funds. We'll need a raise article out of the general fund for the \$6K needed for the mower.
- o JT-What do you need from us?
- LG-Detailed mower quotes.
- o JT-The only other real concern (after the mower) is the -3% budget. This budget would mean a reduction in life guard hours. The budget is bare bones now. The other charges line item is for vandalism.
- BM-At the very best what is the impact if your department goes with level funding?
- o JT-OK with level funding if we get the mower.
- o BM-Do you have revolving funds?
- JT-Yes. By mandate the soccer, basketball, and swimming programs are self-funded by the fees collected.
- O SH-Who handles the raise articles?
- LG-FinCom can recommend one to the BOS.
- SH-Do we have room in the capital budget?
- LG-Wouldn't borrow money for a new lawn mower.

o Review of the Police Department Budget

- o SH-This budget is 90% contract driven?
- o WM-Yes, it is 93% contract related. Any cuts would have to be to personnel.
- o SH-Are there any open positions in the department?
- WM-No. We are fully staffed in terms of what the town allows us to have.
- SH-Do the contracts heave steps or do new employees assume the salaries of those they are replacing?
- WM-Yes, are contracts have steps.
- JK-Are the cruisers replaced on a one year rotation?
- WM-We've gotten down to one replacement per year. This keeps down maintenance costs. Rather not lose the annual replacement but if that's what happens.....
- o JK-Is the \$35K replacement figure for a fully outfitted cruiser?

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WM-Yes. We try to use equipment from prior cruisers but there are changes to the model this year.

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- o LG Led a review of those budgets that have yet to be turned in.
- o LF-I saw that the FinCom budget includes level funding for the reserve fund.
- o BM-Yes, we will level fund the reserve fund.
- o LG-I will look into this but I believe that we cannot use the reserve fund for the schools. The reserve funds usually see a big hit but if we can't use reserve funds for the schools then level funding should be ok.
