CALL TO ORDER

Barrington Conservation Commission (BCC) Chair J. Wallace called the meeting of February 12, 2012 to order at 7:00 p.m.

1. <u>DELEGATION OF VOTING MEMBERS</u>

Chair J. Wallace confirmed the presence of members as stated above

2. GUESTS

A. Mike Speltz, SPNHF

- P. Failing motioned to move to Executive Session considering the upcoming discussion involving the acquisition/sale of property. A. Melvin seconded the motion which passed unanimously with a vote of four (4), to zero (0) in favor.
- A. Melvin motioned to move out of Executive Session. P. Failing seconded the motion which passed unanimously with a vote of four (4), to zero (0) in favor.

B. Paul Morrison, Barrington SnowGoers

Paul Morrison, the Trail Master for the Barrington SnowGoers Club (P.O. Box 146, Barrington, NH 03825) approached the Commission to discuss the trail maintenance and establish a partnership with the Commission as respective users of the Barrington trail systems. Wallace will put him in touch with the Trail Committee.

C. Marika Wilde, Natural Heritage Committee

Marika Wilde, the Chairperson for the Barrington Natural Heritage Committee, approached the Board to discuss a project which Commissioner Anne Melvin is hoping to initiate with the school system to establish a scavenger hunt/letter box hiking event.

3. MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL

A. Conservation Commission Minutes of January 23, 2012

C. Carl motioned to approve the Conservation Commission Meeting Minutes of January 23, 2012 as amended. A. Melvin seconded the motion which passed unanimously with a vote of four (4), to zero (0) in favor.

4. COMPLAINTS

A. Development on Mendums Pond, violating shoreland

Wallace will contact the Mendums Landing Homeowners association to try and get more details.

5. OLD BUSINESS

A. Purchase of Leahy land (abuts SATWaSR): 42 acres: need for appraisal

Wallace reminded the Commission that Heath Appraisal Services (14 Everett Street, Manchester, NH 03104-2462) was selected to complete the summary appraisal work at the cost of \$1,800.00. Wallace informed the Commission that the appraisal work is underway. There were no further updates

B. George Calef: interested in protecting ~300 acres along Isinglass

Chair J. Wallace asked that the Commission re-vote to expend conservation funds for the purchase of fifty (50) percent of the cost of the update of an appraisal for the 300 acre Calef property up to \$2,000.00. The update has been completed and an invoice for \$1500 has been received by the town.

A. Melvin motioned to expend \$1500 from the conservation fund towards the cost of the update of an appraisal for the 300 acre Calef property. C. Carl seconded the motion which passed unanimously with a vote of four (4), to zero (0) in favor.

C. Proposed Disc Golf site, Brooks Road

Chair J. Wallace informed the Commission that the proposed Disc Golf project on Brooks Road still has many issues to address before it can go forward.

D. Town Conservation priorities, updating town co-occurrence map

Clayton Carl supplied the Commission with a copy of the recently completed town co-occurrence map. A discussion ensued regarding the proper manner in which to classify undeveloped town owned land not under conservation restriction. The Commission agreed to retain the current classification and continue to review the map.

E. SATWaSR stewardship – review of Dan Howard's document

Chair Wallace presented the Commission with an Invoice from Dan Howard in the amount of \$1,000.00 for the completion of the Samuel A. Tamposi Water Supply Reserve Management Plan. The Commission expressed an interest in reviewing the final documentation before rendering a final decision on payment.

F. White Crest Conservation easement deed contains errors (with town counsel)

Chair Wallace informed the Commission that the deed is with town counsel.

6. NEW BUSINESS

A. Accept and approve the tentative meeting schedule

Chair J. Wallace presented the Commission with the tentative 2012 Conservation Commission schedule for review and approval.

- P. Failing motioned to accept the tentative 2012 Conservation Commission Meeting Schedule. A. Melvin seconded the motion which passed unanimously with a vote of four (4), to zero (0) in favor.
- B. Light wetland application: changed to minimum impact
- C. Schulz/Carbone survey which option do we want

After some discussion, the commission decided to go with the option of amending the conservation easement deed without recording the survey at the Strafford County Registry of Deeds (expenses for which would come to \$600-800). The amended deed will include a metes and bounds description of the easement area and will refer to the survey as being available at Barrington Town Offices.
