





#### 1. Call to Order/Pledge of Allegiance

Chairman Diane Betkoski called the meeting to order at 6:03 P.M.

Board Members present: Chris Yanarella, Ray Kunz, Chris Bielik

#### 2. Approval of Minutes - October 2011

Motion to accept the October 3, 2011 meeting minutes: Yanarella/Kunz; all approved.

3. <u>Public Comment</u> – Mr. James Agostine, Superintendent, Regional School District #16 Presented an informational session about the upcoming school project going to referendum in December 2011.

He provided background on the issues of the two elementary schools in Prospect, Community & Algonquin schools which are dated, inadequate buildings, a fragmented education (K-3 and grades 4 & 5 are separate), plus Community school needs a roof. He noted that 2 years ago Region 16 purchased a 47 acre parcel on Route 69 now known as "75 New Haven Road"; the proposed 85,000 sq ft K-5 school will use 17 acres of the property which also has some wetlands.

The Board of Education's solution: to have a school all in one building that is more energy efficient and would make more efficient use of custodian and food services.

There's an opportunity to take advantage of the property for an outdoor classroom and walking trails.

Laurel Ledge renovations – the campus style design is not practical. This is not safe for the children or energy efficient to leave the doors open for so long, plus much education time is lost when students have to dress to go outside to get to other parts of the school. There are many deferred maintenance issues such as the concrete above doorways is deteriorating and handicapped bathrooms facilities are needed.

District office – inefficient space for \$56,000 per year in rent

Steps toward a solution:

- Purchased property
- The Board of Education formed an ad hoc committee and brainstormed 32 possibilities.
- A building committee is now in place with representatives from Prospect and Beacon Falls.
- There is a deed restriction on the Algonquin property, that it can only be used for education, recreation or town hall activities. Given this restriction, it is no longer marketable.

Laurel Ledge renovation will include adding corridors to connect buildings, keeping grades separate, each pod will have toilets and office areas; and new science and music rooms. The renovation will occur while the students are in school.

Board of Education offices:  $\sim 10,000$  sq ft, requirement; project includes renovating Algonquin by demolishing 20,000 sq ft of the existing school.

Projected costs: [net cost after state reimbursement which has a deadline of June 2012]
New K-5 school at 75 New Haven Rd = \$36,608,000 [net \$13,911,040]
Laurel Ledge renovations & additions = \$7,746,000 [net \$4,260,300]
District Office in Algonquin space (excavation, abatement) = \$2,371,000 [net \$1,553,005]
Total project costs = \$46,725,000.00 [net \$19,724,345]

Membership renewal for Audubon Society is due.

Received a memo from First Selectman Susan Cable about keeping town hall thermostats at conservative settings.

Received a newsletter from CT Association of Conservation and Inland Wetlands

Vice Chair Anita Goerig and commissioner Jeff Goerig will attend the CT Association of Conservation & Inland Wetlands annual meeting in Wallingford on November 12.

- Chair Diane Betkoski talked with Roman Rosinski from the South West conservation district who suggested having an intern from the Yale School of Forestry help with the planning trails as well as to provide some ideas for keeping ATVs off open space property. She will get more information.
- Diane Betkoski spoke to Tom Harbinson, Chair of the Shelton Conservation Commission, and compared what the two towns are doing, BF doing the right things, good contact for networking
- Chris Yanarella spoke to Roman Rosinski & Elaine Sych about other towns allowing ATVs to use open space, he also talked to NE ATV rider's assoc, clubs, etc. all agreed it was a bad idea. The question came up if the local police would have authority to ticket offenders of misuse, suggestion a mandatory fine and attendance of a conservation course on proper ATV riding.

**ACTION:** Chair Diane Betkoski will write a letter to the Board of Selectmen asking if the Beacon Falls police have the authority to issue citations for misuse (littering, ATV abuse) of town open space parcels.





#### 1. Call to Order

Chairman Diane Betkoski called the meeting to order at 6:02 P.M.

Board Members present: Vice Chair Anita Goerig, Chris Yanarella, Ray Kunz, Chris Bielik

Absent: Jeff Goerig

Public present: Patrick O'Dell from Boy Scout Troop 104

#### 2. Approval of Minutes – September 2011

Motion to accept the September 12, 2011 meeting minutes: A Goerig/Yanarella; all approved.

#### 3. Public Comment - Patrick O'Dell

Chairman Betkoski welcomed him to the Conservation Commission meeting.

A Goerig asked Patrick to explain how the Troop proceeded with the Storm Drain Management. He reported that he worked with J. Mylan on the project for his Eagle Scout Badge with Boy Scout Troop 104. The Scouts met over 3 Saturdays and split in separate groups with adult drivers following maps to mark several hundred drains each weekend. Patrick O'Dell and the troop marked 876 storm drains for a total of 170 manhours. He noted these obstacles: the planning and organizing to make most efficient use of volunteers and weather causing delays until spring as it was too cold for the labels to stick.

D Betkoski reiterated the importance of volunteers and involving younger adults in the work of the Conservation Commission

P O'Dell noted that the Boy Scouts are always looking for Eagle Scout projects.

R Kunz suggested the Scouts may wish to get involved with the bat habitats. R Kunz noted that one or more houses for bats must be installed in the right location, during the right time of year, 20 feet off the ground, near water/food source, and the need to identify appropriate locations in town for houses to be installed.

A Goerig noted that Park & Rec installed bat houses in Matthies Park & Pent Road facility and P O'Dell said this was an Eagle Scout project in the past.

Ideally the bat habitats should be put up in late summer/early autumn; a project for 2012.

#### 4. Correspondence

A Goerig announced the receipt of a \$100 donation from the Lioness Club of Beacon Falls for the Community Forum.

ACTION: A Goerig will send the Lioness Club a thank you note for their donation. Received a Water & soil newsletter; a letter from CTNOFA about their 3 publications available. C Bielik suggested having a link from the town/CC web site to these publications.

A Goerig suggested having a spot outside the library to keep brochures and related Conservation materials for reference.

D Betkoski shared several brochures that she picked up from the Kellogg Environmental Center.

Received a letter from the Land use academy offering training workshops on Sat. Nov 5 at CCSU.

#### 5. Storm Drain Management - Diane Betkoski

Kudos to Patrick O'Dell for his report.

C Bielik remarked that he discovered a missing storm drain marker on Rimmon Hill Rd.

**ACTION:** D Betkoski will check on reordering markers for drains.

R Kunz noted that there was a clogged drain at Pent & Lopus Roads.

Discussion about ongoing maintenance of the drains.

**ACTION:** D Betkoski will inform the Board of Selectmen that the drain marking project is complete and inquire how the town plans to manage the ongoing monitoring and maintenance of these markers. One suggestion might be adding information on the town web site about whom to contact if someone finds an unmarked or clogged drain or an exposed water valve drain in the road.

#### 6. Outreach - Anita Goerig

Duck Race: Saturday October 1: Thanks to Chris Yanarella for setting up and manning the table. C Yanarella noted that many people knew about the event beforehand, had some questions, kudos about the good publicity, and there was a lot of interest.

#### Community Forum Thursday October 13 (4-9 PM) at WRHS Auditorium

- Anita Goerig will meet with the teachers again before the event.
- O Volunteers are needed to fold program guides, to sell/serve pizza, sodas, snacks, water and to keep students moving from station to station during the CT science center interactive exhibits. Diane Betkoski and Chris Bielik will help in cafeteria.
- o Jeff Goerig will welcome people and hand out bags.
- O There will be a full page ad will be in the October 7 edition of Citizen's News
- o Exhibitors will set up at 3:30
- o The program guide is completed, just needs to be printed.

#### **Discovery Day** Friday October 14 (8AM–1PM) at Matthies Park

- o 183 6<sup>th</sup> graders and 25 high school students will participate.
- o Areas in Matthies Park will need to be roped off. Nine 6<sup>th</sup> grade teachers will chaperone.
- o Expect 300 people at this event
- A Goerig commented that she has built great relationships with the educators through this event.

#### 8. Open Space Management

- Lantern Ridge ERT Report D Betkoski has been researching various types of signage for passive recreational trail use, educational, directional, informational, warning, interpretative, and identification for species, foliage, and rocks. She also contacted Sam Gold from COG for suggestions on possible vendors. Once this information gathering is complete she can estimate how many signs are needed and the overall cost which will be included in a report to the Board of Selectmen.
  - R Kunz suggested having an informational map at the entrance of the property.
- Updates from Seymour Anita Goerig Regarding the February 23, 2011 letter to Mr. Jezierney, Town of Seymour inland wetlands enforcement officer, she spoke to him about the Seymour entrance point into Lantern Ridge. Discussion ensued about recommendations to limit use of ATVs by fencing the area and/or installing cameras but enforcement would be an issue. The question was raised on how many physical steps the Conservation Commission would take to deter damage and abuse, to include signage, rope fencing, boulders, and clearly mark that it is Beacon Falls town property for passive usage, and request selfreport of violations.

Chris Yanarella suggested opening the space to ATVs and let local clubs police the area and report any damage, any abuse and the clubs would lose the privilege of use. D Betkoski questioned how this type of use could be incorporated as a mixed-use of this space since the recommendation of the ERT report is for passive use, conservation and recreation. There is also the question of liability to the town for use of open space.

**ACTION:** Chris Yanarella will research if any ATV clubs are allowed to use town open space and how other towns have dealt with it. This information can be added to ERT report as another aspect considered for the property.

#### 9. Land Use Committee Update - Diane Betkoski

- Plan of Conservation & Development Update D Betkoski
   Attended meeting on September 28 with Brian Miller, Town Planner

The core of the down town will be retail; the industrial area and areas of future economic growth, the suburban neighborhood area, established residential areas and rural, undeveloped and/or protected open space.

The plan is to be completed by November, and then will go through P&Z for approval. The COG will look at it then it will go to a town meeting for approval.

• Toby's Pond and Recreational Area – D Betkoski Discussion at the Land Use meeting about the lack of maintenance performed at this area. Discussion on who owns this property, who is responsible for management and maintenance of the area.

First Sclectman Susan Cable was kept up to date on these problems. A Goerig noted that the granite bench dedicated to Ed Jurzynski needs to be moved further away from the river, it was under water. This was discussed in the meeting stating that the bench had been taken off site to repair but was put back in the incorrect location.

**New Business:** 

Chris Bielik shared information about supporting wind power (<a href="www.communityenergyinc.com/ct">www.communityenergyinc.com/ct</a>) by adding green energy sources into the energy grid. Discussions ensued regarding zoning, noise level, and if there are any restrictions or current zoning guidelines.



#### 1. Call to Order

Chairman Diane Betkoski called the meeting to order at 6:01 P.M.

Present: Board Members Vice Chair Anita Goerig, Jeff Goerig, Chris Yanarella, Ray Kunz, Chris Bielik

Motion to accept September 12, 2011 agenda: Yanarella/Bielik; all approved.

#### 2. Approval of Minutes – August 2011

Motion to accept the August 1, 2011 meeting minutes: A Goerig/Kunz; all approved. C Bielik abstained as he was not present at the August meeting.

#### 3. Public Comment - none

#### 4. Correspondence

Received July 21 meeting minutes from Planning & Zoning; items included: heating oil storage improvements; discussion of a potential adult entertainment business in town. Nothing significant to impact the Conservation Commission.

#### 5. Storm Drain Management - Diane Betkoski

Boy Scout Troop 104 will continue to monitor the markings on the drains. Discussion about exposed water valve drains on roads, probably due to the high ground water beneath the roads, which creates a possible liability to the town.

Motion for Chairman Diane Betkoski to write a memo to the Board of Selectman identifying the exposed water valve drains on roads as a problem as well as gravel washing out in several locations. Also she will inquire what the plan is to address these problems along with the vegetation growing out of the storm drains: Bielik/Yanarella; all approved.

#### 6. Outreach - Anita Goerig

- o A Goerig has invited the Boy Scout troop 104 to the October 3 meeting.
- Chris Bielik passed on positive feedback to Anita Goerig on the CONSERV Publication.
- o Kudos to A Goerig from D Betkoski on the quality of the CONSERV brochure.

#### Community Forum Thursday October 13 (4-9 PM) at WRHS Auditorium

- A Goerig will have a list of duties for Conservation Commissioners to sign up for at the October 3 meeting.
- o C Yanarella will look for materials needed to construct a sandwich board sign to put on the median downtown to advertise these events.
- o Food pizza and snacks will be available during the Community Forum.
- o A Goerig requested that members distribute the flyers she handed out.
- o The CT Parks and Forests Association will have a vendor table at Forum
- o A Goerig created a display outside the library to promote the 2-day event.
- o Gabriel's Bike Shop and CT Outdoors will have tables. COG, Boy Scouts, and sponsors will also have tables.
- o Tabletop exhibits and student volunteers have been secured for the Forum.
- o All vendors have received a map of the location of their table at the Forum.
- Press releases have been sent out on the 2-day event and sponsors who are donating funds. The latest article in Citizens News was presented.
- The commissions' web site, Blog, Twitter and Facebook pages are updated continually for viewers to see current information.

### The Forum and Discovery Day events have been generously sponsored by community businesses and non-profit agencies.

#### Discovery Day Friday October 14 (8AM-1PM) at Matthies Park

- o A Goerig has secured Lori Brandt, Education Director with CT Parks and Forests Association as another leader for the event.
- o A Goerig met with 6 teachers: Dr. Elizabeth Johnson, Post University; Jill Blasi & Lisa Croce, WRHS; Kristin Bernier, Sandra Pantaleo & Diana Shiboski LRMS to flush out all the details of the event. Next meeting date 9/26 at 2:30 PM.
- o A Goerig has a list of action items as a result of the meeting.
- A Goerig reports that the number of students attending the Discovery Day event is
   250. Students will be broken into 8 groups for manageability.
- Total number of science stations is 6, including the soil pit. The day will end with a scavenger hunt.
- o A Goerig hired the buses to transport the 6<sup>th</sup> graders to Matthies Park.
- O Discovery Day will be filmed by R-Media of Danbury.
- o A Goerig has asked Peter Betkoski to dig 2 soil pits with his back-hoe. She has put Professor Elizabeth Johnson in touch with Peter to work out details.

#### 7. Natural Resource Inventory – Jeff Goerig

J Goerig continues to incorporate information from 7 key reports into the NRI which is ongoing process.

Bird & bat habitat: J Goerig has asked R Kunz to help with building blue bird houses. Ray Kunz – reported that he gathered information from the CT DEEP & Audubon society about optimum materials for bird houses. He volunteered to create a how-to sheet including picture of what the blue bird would house look like and would make up the kits, using wood with pre-drilled holes, etc.

- R Kunz requested help on the administrative part of this project to include advertising, collecting money for kits, handling signups for children and their parents as this would be a good project for an adult and a child; using this as a program in conjunction with the library was suggested as it has these mechanisms in place.
- R Kunz requested some research help as he would like to include some information on the structure of the bird house to include in the kit: why it's built the way it is, how it attracts the birds, it uses imitation suct embedded with sunflower seeds rather than the whole sunflower seed, it would include dowels on the outside so the birds can sit and eat.
- A Goerig commented that Toby's Pond would be an ideal site for them to be installed.
- D Betkoski sited the Conservation Commission goals for 2011 to develop a habitat program for birds & bats as well as reaching out to the community and promoting student involvement in activities. This project may need to be coordinated with other town commissions and boards.
- D Betkoski suggested keeping the Park & Rec department involved.
- R Kunz suggested getting the Boy Scouts to help assemble and distribute the houses.
- Tabled until 2012. J Goerig will contact R Kunz offline to discuss plans. J Goerig would like set a spring 2012 target date to have bird & bat houses ready for distribution.

#### 8. Open Space Management

• Lantern Ridge – ERT Report

- J Goerig sent this report to J Galligan, town engineer, but no response yet.

Such a practice could prevent extensive poaching, suspected from the deer stand on the site. 

The Conservation Commission will also request volunteer involvement for marking, weeding, etc. and see what funding is available. A. Goerig volunteered to research the fundraising and education components.

**ACTION:** J. Goerig will email his notes on the Lantern Ridge report to the committee members.

#### 9. Land Use Committee Update

- Plan of Conservation & Development Update D. Betkoski provided an update on a discussion from the June 22 meeting where it was reported that a request has been made to transfer money from O&G Industries gift fund to support the Streetscape project. She reviewed a July 5 letter written by the chair of the Land Use Committee to the chair of the Planning & Zoning Commission, asking that these funds not be transferred. #### Call to Order

A. Goerig called the regular monthly meeting of the Beacon Falls Conservation Commission to order at 7:45 p.m.

Present: Vice Chair A. Goerig, Commissioners: J. Goerig, C. Bielik and C. Yarnarella

Others present: Resident Marlene Sandel, 135 Beacon Valley Road and guest speaker Amy Blaymore Paterson - Executive Director, Land Conservator Council

Minutes of March 7, 2011

C. Bielik motioned to approve the minutes of March 7, 2011. C. Yarnarella 2nd the motion. All voted aye.

#### **Public Comment**

Marlene Sandel, 135 Beacon Valley Road, spoke about the Osprey and wondered if they could get another platform nest. She suggested that there be a webcam that could stream it into the town website and maybe have a day dedicated to the Osprey return. She suggested that maybe the children could get involved with a guessing game as to when they would return. She noted that this is done in other towns. A. Goerig thought it was a great idea. The only draw-back would be that they are on the rail line.

A discussion continued regarding WIFI and how it would be possible.

M. Sandel suggested that she will be contacting DEP because she is worried about their mortality.

A lengthy discussion continued regarding the Osprey.

#### Correspondence reviewed

**A.** A. Goerig read an email from R. Minnick regarding marking up plans as they pertain to trails linking to the greenway.

Land use, economic development and environmental planning from Turner Miller was briefly discussed. It was noted that it is good information and all should review it.

#### Guest: Amy Blaymore Paterson, Executive Director, Land Conservation Council.

Amy introduced herself noting that they are an organization that works together in protecting land forever. Amy spoke noting that after speaking with the committee that she does not believe that it is a Land Trust that this committee is looking for but suggested a "Friends Of" which would suit this committee more appropriately.

A. Paterson noted that "Friends of" groups have grant opportunities as private non-profit. They can get grant funds (usually which have to be matched). Amy noted that they are great groups and work very well.

A. Goerig asked if CLCC could assist them. A. Patterson basically noted that if they were to help, it would be on a fee for service. She noted that she is the only person on staff and she could trouble shoot with them but really only point them in the right direction. She noted that they would need an attorney to help get the 501C3. She noted that she could point them in the right direction of an attorney to have a legal entity bringing in funds. She suggested that this Conservation Commission talk with other "Friends Of" groups. C. Yarnarella suggested that they start with Vernon since it is such a successful group.

M. Sandal noted that she works with a "Friends of" group in Ansonia and they do a lot of work to raise money.

A. Paterson suggested that everyone get on her informative ENews list so that all are kept informed on what's going on in Hartford. She also suggested that A. Goerig will be her point of contact going forward for informational purposes.

A. Paterson encouraged the group to research further and stay informed. She suggested that they rally people to get to Public Hearings. She noted that networking, collaboration and cooperation is very important. A. Paterson suggested that one person from each group rally people for networking and workshops and she suggested that A. Goerig be that person. A. Paterson also suggested that this group contact all the neighboring land trusts. She suggested that they be invited to one of their meetings or visa-versa to share thoughts and ideas and what they could do to work with each other.

A. Paterson handed out booklets on Conservation Options for Connecticut Farmland.

All thanked A. Paterson for coming and her presentation. It was noted that they will stay in touch and informed.

#### **Storm Drain Management**

a. A. Goerig received a confirmation from S. Peterson that they will present to troop 104, Patrick O'Dell for what they did with their Eagle Troop and to J. Mylen. A. Goerig noted that she is trying to get J. Mylen to one of these meetings.

#### Outreach

- a. A draft of the newsletter was presented A conversation took place regarding changes that have been made and more changes that will be coming. C. Yarnerella will review the changes that A. Goerig made and respond to her via email if it's all set.
- b. A. Goerig noted that Habitat is something that this group should be focusing on. Maybe it's something they can announce for next year. M. Sandel noted that she has been involved with blue bird trails and noted that she has written a paper on them. M. Sandel noted that she's been involved in a lot of different things.

A. Goerig noted that she feels very confident that she can raise \$6,500.

M. Sandel asked about Katharine Matthies and how they used to give out money. A. Goerig noted that she will look into this.

Lantern Ridge was discussed and C. Bielik suggested that they pick a month and dedicate a working group to discuss this.

A. Goerig asked that everyone read the reports and go through them and bring some ideas to the June meeting. She noted that once they have some solid ideas, they should then meet on specifics.

It was noted that **River bend Park** is something that Diane has been working on so they will have to wait on that.

Land Use Committee Update - it was noted that nothing has happened with this, C. Bielik noted that J. Rodrigo seems to be content with the recent revision which takes "Parks and Rec" by name, out of the ordinance. It was noted that this should move forward. A. Goerig will look into this.

C. Yarnarella motioned to adjourn the meeting at 8:50 P.M. C. Bielik 2nd the motion. All voted aye.





#### 1. Call to Order

Chair Betkoski called the regular monthly meeting of the Beacon Falls Conservation Commission to order at 7:34 p.m.

#### 2. Minutes of February 7, 2011 meeting

#### 3. Public Comment - none

#### 4. Guest: Sam Gold, ACIP and Senior Planner for the Council of Governments

Discussion ensued on the Naugatuck River Greenway Routing project which is 44 miles of a multi-use recreational trail running from Torrington to Derby, all towns along the way are involved. COG received a grant to do routing study to see where trail could go, 5 towns along river are in this region. A report was completed in January regarding costs, phases, efforts. These reports are available online, as well as town-specific reports.

The road to Toby's Pond is a potential trail location, through the wash plant, connecting to hiking trails through Murtha Industrial Park, or to continue on route 42 to connect to River Bend Park. Building a small bridge across the water might be feasible. Options to connect to Naugatuck: go West up Cold Spring Rd through the state forest but the road would need to be improved. East side option: utilize about a mile and a half of old route 8, but that option would lose access to west side of the state forest. Routing study: even if the trail is not connected to other towns, from the center of Beacon Falls you can connect to Toby's Pond and the state forest. A river bank clean up in all 5 towns is tentatively set for Saturday May 14 from 8:30-11:30 AM. Looking for volunteers; the kayak/canoe river race is set for May 7. The Beacon Falls 5k road race will be on Saturday morning, May 14.

Boy Scout Troop 104 may be planning a river clean up too, Vice Chair A. Goerig will check on that effort.

Haynes has a proposal for developing a project for the southern part of Beacon Falls with a connector road near Toby's Pond to Seymour.

- a. Clerical vacancy Lauren Classey will be the new permanent clerk.
   Martha Melville will serve as relief clerk, when necessary.
- b. Member Role & Responsibilities outlined in ordinance

Commissioner C. Yarnarella suggests that the members use an electronic calendar with reminders of meetings.



#### Called To Order:

Chair Diane Betkoski called the regular monthly meeting of the Beacon Falls Conservation Commission to order at 7:36 pm. Meeting took place in the Conference Room.

**Present:** Chair D. Betkoski, Vice Chair A. Goerig, Secretary W. Chellis, Commissioners: J. Goerig, C. Bielik and C. Yanarella

Absent: M. Kempa, Recording Secretary

Also present: Public (1), Joe Rodrigo, Land Use Committee Member, 42 Bonna St.

First items, not on agenda. Chair Betkoski noted the absence of Recording Secretary Kempa, and asked Secretary Chellis to handle the minutes for the meeting. He agreed. No audio recording of meeting was made.

VC Goerig says she felt that the proposed ordinance was driving a wedge between the member commissions of the Land Use Committee.

Chris Bielik asked Mr. Rodrigo why he felt that the ordinance was not a a good document. Mr. Rodrigo stated that he felt the ordinance was a bad document from the beginning.

He recommends that for it to move forward, it must not contain any restrictions on the Park & Rec commission.

VC Goerig suggests that BFCC and P&R meet to iron out the differences soon.

Mr. Rodrigo suggests that this occur at the next Land Use Committee meeting.

Chair Betkoski, agrees, and says that it will be on the agenda for that meeting.

She further adds that the intent of this ordinance is not self serving for BFCC, but is for the

benefit of the whole Town.

Intent aside. Mr. Rodrigo is unhappy with the wording of the document. As an example, Mr. Rodrigo says that if passed, the Land Use Ordinance would allow the BFCC to block Parks & Rec from administering Toby's Landing as it saw fit. He objects to that.

VC Goerig & Commissioner Bielek suggest that Attorney Byrne be present at next Land Use Committee meeting. Chair Betkoski would like the Attorney to bring the source materials he used to help draft the ordinance.

#### **Executive Session**

The door was closed and an Executive Session to discuss an internal organization issue began at 8:00 pm. The door was opened and the Executive Session Ended at 8:25 pm. No minutes were recorded of the Executive Session.

#### **More Public Comment**






