Old Business

Nitrogen & Phosphorus Removal – Treatment Plant

Jay Sheehan, P.E. from Woodard & Curran came before the board concerning the Wastewater Facilities Plan. Mr. Sheehan presented an Overall Project Sequence to the board:

Task 1 – is to finalize the CWF Application, the majority of the application is ready. First Selectman Gerard Smith is gathering supplemental information from the Town on the annual budget which will be included in the application. The application will then be submitted to the State to finalize the approval process.

Task 3 – this fall collection system mapping will begin. The high flows at the Treatment Plant will tie in with the nitrogen and phosphorus removal which will also begin this fall.

Task 4 - Next spring I&I work will begin to try to remove clean water out of the collection system.

The goal is to remain on schedule for the spring to be able to install flow meters throughout the system to find out where the I&I is coming from.

This is basically the planning phase which will be 18 - 24 months. Start to finish of construction for phosphorus upgrades will be approximately 2 - 4 years.

Currently, there is a contract for the planning phase. The recommendations have to be finalized and have to be submitted to the State, then DEEP will approve and then the Town will be eligible for funds. Then the process of design and construction begins. Chairman Jeffrey Smith asked about time limits. From the time the permit is received until the time you have to implement the recommendations, it depends how long your permit limits are (usually 3, 4 or 5 years). The Town had 90 days to select a consultant which has been done.

Treatment Plant Drainage System

Walter Opuszynski, Treatment Plant Supervisor mentioned that a FEMA Grant reply for the reconstruction of the drainage system at the Treatment Plant. The grant was not approved. There is 60 days to reapply. The amount is for \$400,000. A new line will have to be installed to the river. Also, a new line will be constructed to be water to the treatment plant. First Selectman Gerard Smith asked if Jim Galligan, Town Engineer is going to reapply. Walter will contact Jim Galligan.
