#### G. Town Seal

- 1. Rita, Bruce and Sandi attended the Selectboard meeting March 4
  - a. Discussed terminology of logo vs. seal
  - b. Selectboard voted against changing the seal 2-1
  - c. Ed Gibson suggested allowing the 250<sup>th</sup> Committee to go forward with public submissions; see what is received, decide whether any new design would be appropriate for the 250<sup>th</sup> logo, town flag and/or town seal; Jeanne Pryor made a motion to allow the Committee to continue, seconded, passed
- 2. Bruce read from "A Bicentennial History of Becket 1765-1965" (page 180 in the paperback edition) "A word of thanks goes also to Miss Linda Spencer for the cover design, patterned after the old town seal"
- 3. Sandi read from an email sent 28 March 2005 from then Town Clerk, Jeanne Pryor, to Catherine Stover, then Town Clerk of Nantucket about the history of Becket's town seal:
  - "At its meeting on March 20, 1900, per Article 14, the Town of Becket voted 'that the Town Clerk be instructed to procure a suitable Town Seal.'
  - 'At its meeting on March 19, 1901, per Article 10, the Town of Becket voted "to accept the Seal purchased by O.S. Willis as the legal Town Seal. The design of said Seal represents a mounted Sir Knight carrying the flag.'

The Annual Report of the Town of Becket for the Year Ending March 1<sup>st,</sup> 1901, page 10, includes the following under Miscellaneous Bills:

Paid C. C. Hoffman for making the Town Seal......\$12.00 The following was written by M. J. Mulholland, a member of the Becket Historical Commission from 1990-1995:

Why "Sir Knight Becket" is inappropriate on the Town Seal.

The Town Seal was voted and procured locally in the 1890's. The legend "Sir Knight Becket" is unexplained, except for an undocumented report that the design was chosen as a result of a schoolchildren's competition. Be that as it may, the design has no roots in history."

4. Committee members requested a copy of the entire email be sent to them, Sandi sent a copy 8 April 2014, Jeanne gave her permission to share the information which is on file in the Historic Commission room

  - a. Print labels with owl, Becket 250<sup>th</sup> Anniversary 1765-2015, HOOT, and student name for the front of each memo book
  - b. Student photo on inside cover
  - c. Print name of each historic site to be discovered on single pages
  - d. Earn a stamp or sticker at each location
  - e. Need to purchase books, labels, packing tape, stamps/stickers; cost about 40 cents per passport
  - f. Print labels for back cover with list of locations
  - g. Will students or volunteers assemble the passports;

    - 2. Need to discuss activities with Becket Washington school staff
      - a. Geocache activities
      - b. Memorial Day art show

- 3. Land Trust president and secretary, Ken and Linda Smith have offered to conduct tours during celebration; possible dates May 24, June 13
- 4. Bills Bruce moved to pay the following, seconded, passed unanimously

  - b. Reimburse Karen Karlberg for website hosting \$96.00, RVIXC Sales
  - c. Atlas Pyro Vision Productions, Inc., fireworks \$450.00 down payment to vendor
