

SHERWOOD GREENS ROAD IMPROVEMENT AND MAINTENANCE DISTRICT

PRUDENTIAL COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

JUNE 27, 2015

The meeting was called to order at 10:04 AM.

Present were Prudential Committee members: Terry Hayden, Ken Einhorn, Margaret Rodriguez, Joe Gaze, Ken Einhorn, and Michael Lavery Also present were: Kathy Borden, Treasurer; Mary White, Clerk; and Nathan Sondrini.

The May minutes were reviewed and accepted.

The Treasurer's report was reviewed and accepted.

The Warrant was reviewed and signed, after some discussion as to divers' hours and wages, and also attorney fees.

Road report:

Due to Jaime's absence, the report was read by Margaret. Not much happened during June. Some work was done between Kotkin's and Bow North. Elizabeth Sonier reported a tree down. It was a 16" tree and was removed in about 30 minutes. \$1,000.00 (out of up to \$5000.00 which was approved) was paid to Ken Hunter for the repair of signs and landscaping of the entrance way.

The road report was accepted.

Lakes report:

So far this year, we have spent \$50.00 for beach permit, and approx. \$1,400.00 for water testing. The E-Coli count has been between 7 1/2 to 150, which is acceptable. Nathan suggested that periodic raking of goose droppings might help to keep the E-Coli count down. Margaret questioned if we should also test for Guardia. Divers spent 32-35 hours on Silver Shield, for a total of 50 hours. The divers are part time, and come as they can. We are fortunate that Ken Hunter will provide a trailer for divers to put weeds in, and then he will haul it away. Aquatic Control found that Little Long Bow has high density growth of Large Leaf Pond Weed. The divers should be able to get rid of that in approx. 10-15 hours. Long Bow has mostly low density, which is good. Ken interviewed a full time diver, but that fell through, so the pulling will be slower, but will be done. Nathan said there is a divers' web site that we could go to for divers. There as a dense growth of Bladder Wart at the end of Long Bow Lake. This should be thinned rather than gotten rid of, since it is beneficial as a habitat for fish and other lake life. There was some discussion of how funds are allocated for lakes.

The Lakes report was accepted.

Grant Process:

Michael filed on-line for a grant. Margaret will be away for part of July, and is not sure if she will have time to meet the August 9th deadline. Margaret explained that grant money is pooled for towns.

Additional business:

Nathan asked about, and Mary explained, the procedure for tax collection for Sherwood Greens. He also showed a map of his property location. He will need 160' of road improved in order to build his home. This will be discussed at the August meeting.

The next meeting will be on August 1, 2015

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:00.
