1. CALL TO ORDER:

2. ROLL CALL - ATTENDANCE:

3. TOWN ADMINISTRATOR REPORTS:

HVAC Schedule – Municipal Center Hours – July:

The heavy duty crane will arrive on Wednesday, July 8, 2015 and set up in the back of Town Hall. There will be no vehicle parking (except for public safety vehicles) in this area from July 8th through July 10th. The crane will be installing a 3 ¼ piece of HVAC equipment and removing the old equipment from the roof. For safety reasons, Town Hall will be closed on Thursday, July 9th and Friday, July 10th. Notices of the closure will be posted on the web site and on our cable station.

The installation of the new boiler system has begun and is expected to be completed in September.

4. RYAN LAW OFFICE - 1 MANN STREET:

Mr. Edgar Boiteau, Jr., represented by Attorney Ryan, came before the Board of Selectmen with a request to have the Town forgive the Financial Assistance that was awarded to his father who is now in a nursing home so that the property could be sold. In order for the Town to forgive the loan, it would have to be more than 15 years ago. It was determined that the original loan was made in 2005 and therefore could not be forgiven.

A motion was made by Mrs. Bik, seconded by Mr. Haughey, to authorize the Town Administrator to sign the payoff statement for \$7,700 once it has been paid. There was no discussion and the vote was unanimous.

5. 61-A LINCOLN STREET:

The Board of Selectmen is considering purchasing 57 acres of 61-A land (zoned as agricultural) at 187 Lincoln Street. The house and its 2 acres on the property will not be part of the proposed purchase. Mr. Keyes has been authorized by the Board of Selectmen to negotiate with the seller and report his findings to the Board on July 14, 2015. If the negotiations are positive, a Special Town Meeting will be set in September for the voters to decide if the Town should purchase the property.

• Reserve Fund Transfers:

• Inter-Departmental Transfers:

• HVAC Schedule – Municipal Center Hours – July:

Mr. Keyes has been authorized by the Board of Selectmen to negotiate with the seller and report his findings to the Board on July 14, 2015. A motion was made by Mrs. Bik, seconded by Mr. Haughey, to allow the Town Administrator to continue negotiations for acquiring the property (57 acres) at 187 Lincoln Street. There was no further discussion and the vote was unanimous.
