Amory reported on the benefits of a surveillance only program is the opportunity to see the virus in pools before it meets humans or horses. This information becomes a baseline for future collections. It can be used as a tool to alter activities to avoid exposure. It is the most reasonably priced program.

The program includes 3 traps to be dispersed through the town and checked weekly. Traps can be moved during the season.
