

Annual Town Meeting, March 3, 1952 (Cont'd)

- Article 8 Voted to increase the compensation for labor in the highway and tree departments to \$1.25 per hour, all other labor to be compensated at \$1.00 per hour.
- Article 9 Voted that such action as may be deemed best in regard to making roads passable when encumbered with snow be left to the town highway surveyors.
- Article 10 Voted that determining when the taxes shall be committed to the Collector, also the manner of collecting the same, be left in the hands of the Assessors of Taxes.
- Article 11 Voted to raise and appropriate \$400.00 to be divided equally between the two libraries for use towards the maintenance of same.
- Article 12 Voted to appropriate \$322.68 refunded from the County on account of dog licenses to be shared equally between the libraries of the two parishes.
- Article 13 Voted to appropriate a sum not to exceed \$7000.00 from the Surplus Revenue for the purpose of reducing the 1952 tax levy, subject to the provisions of the General Laws.
- Article 14 Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to continue the improvement of Glendale Rd. to the North Andover Town line.
- Article 15 Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000.00 to continue the improvement of Main St. from the section completed in 1951 toward West Bofford.
- Article 16 Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75.00 for further conditioning and upkeep of the Ancient Graves in the Bofford Village Cemetery.

Annual Town Meeting, March 3, 1952 (Cont'd)

- Article 17 Voted to transfer to the Parish of the First Church of Bofford a certain parcel of land now known as "Common Land" bordered by the property of Frank A. Manny and Annette Sawyer Manny on the west, property of the Parish of the First Church on the north, and Middleton Road on the south and east, for the sum of \$1.00 subject to the approval of the Board of Selectmen.
- Article 18 Voted that the sum of \$833.79 be transferred from funds of last year's School Building Committee to present Schoolhouse Committee.
- Article 19 No action taken
- Article 20 Voted to install an electric street light in front of the residence of Oscar O. Anderson on Lake Shore Road.
- Article 21 Voted to adjourn at 11:00 p.m. until 6:30 a.m. the next morning for the annual election of officers of the town.

Article V ~~To be~~ Voted to appropriate the sum of 1900.00 to meet the State & County Allotments for highways, and any other highway re-location, repair, or construction done in anticipation of reimbursement, said money when re-imbursed to be credited to Surplus Revenue.

Article V<sup>6</sup> Voted to transfer the sum of 194.13 to the Board of Health Account from the 1951 unexpended school account.
