- 8 Voted 137 yes, 70 no, by secret ballot and use of checklist not to amend the zoning By-law. This ~~vote~~ action required a $\frac{2}{3}$ vote for amendment of the by-law.
- Mr. Charles W. Eliot, who has been engaged in drawing up a Master Plan for the town over the last eighteen months, was not permitted to address the meeting because one voter objected. Unanimous consent is required for a non-voter.

- 9 The town voted to accept as public ways or streets the following: (1) Pinehurst Drive and Crest Circle in Country Pines subdivision (2) Woodcrest Road, Spruce Circle, Redwood Circle, and Beechwood Circle in Belford Highlands subdivision (3) King Richard's Drive, King Arthur's Court, approximately one half mile of King John's Drive to and including Lot 33, and King James' Court in King's Forest subdivision (4) Mill Run Road in Mill Run Sub-division (5) ~~Glen Forest Drive in Herick Woodlands Sub-division.~~ All roads were approved by the committee set up for that purpose.

Annual Town Meeting, March 5, 1962

The voters of Belford met at the Masonomet Regional District High School at 8 P.M. on March 5, 1962 with about 275 residents present. William J. Greiner, Jr., the moderator, called for a moment of silent prayer before opening the meeting.

Charles Love, representing the Explorer Scouts, presented the town with a new 50 star flag, and Mr. Harry L. Cole, chairman of the Board of Selectmen, accepted the gift. Other Explorer Scouts on the stage were Christopher Cross, David French, and Kent Nickerson.

Harry E. Trask, chairman of the Board of Assessors presented Mr. Simeon S. Pearl with a scroll in recognition of his 36 years as tax collector from 1925 to March 1961. Mrs. Simeon Pearl received a bouquet of flowers.

The action taken on the business meeting was as follows:

- Art. 1 Voted to accept the reports of the various Town Officers and Committees as printed in the Annual Town Report.
- Art. 2 Voted to adopt the budget as printed with the following changes: Planning Board increased from \$750.00 to \$1500.00; Snow Removal and Sanding increased from \$12,000.00 to \$14,000.00; Town Reports increased from \$955.00 to \$1100.00; and \$1500.00 was allotted to the Conservation Fund.
- Art. 3 Voted to appropriate \$1500.00 for the maintenance of Road Machinery, said amount to be transferred from Road Machinery Fund.
- Art. 4 Voted to appropriate \$7,000.00 for the Reserve Fund, said amount to be transferred from Overlay Reserve.

- Art. 5 Voted to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow money from time to time, in anticipation of the revenues of the financial year beginning Jan. 1, 1962, and to issue a note or notes therefor, payable within one year, and to renew any note or notes as may be given for a period of less than one year in accordance with Section 17, Chapter 44, of the General Laws.
- Art. 6 Voted to pass over
- Art. 7 Voted to pass over
- Art. 8 Voted to appropriate \$438.11 refunded from the County on account of dog licenses, said sum to be divided equally between the two libraries of the town.
- Art. 9 Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,100.00 to be divided equally between the two libraries of the town for use toward the maintenance of said libraries.
- Art. 10 Voted to accept the provisions of Ch. 760 of the Acts of 1960 relative to State Aid for Public Libraries.
- Art. 11 Voted to raise and appropriate \$18,270.00 for the purpose of providing the Town's share of the cost of the Regional District School Committee to pay for an architect, or other professional services, to draw plans and specifications for a regional junior high school to be erected on land already owned by the Regional, District, in accordance with the original agreement with the towns of Topsfield and Middleton establishing the Regional School District as amended by vote of the member towns in 1961, and to direct the

- Town Treasurer to pay over said sum to the Regional District School Committee to be used only in conjunction with funds appropriated by the other two member towns for this purpose.
- Art. 12 Voted under Chapter 41, Section 4A, to authorize the Selectmen to appoint any of their members to serve as Veteran's Agent without salary.
- Art. 13 Voted to pass over
- Art. 14 Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,250.00 to be used in conjunction with State and County funds to continue the improvement of Washington St. under Chapter 90.
- Art. 15 Voted to appropriate from Surplus Revenue the sum of \$36,075.00 to meet the State and County allotments for highways, the money when reimbursed to be credited to Surplus Revenue.
- Art. 16 Voted to transfer from available funds the sum of \$104,000.00 for the purpose of adding to the stabilization fund as provided by Section 5B, Chapter 40, of the General Laws.
- Art. 17 Voted to raise and appropriate \$15,000.00 to be used by the School Building Committee for the purpose of engaging an architect to draw up preliminary plans for additional elementary school facilities, and for associated engineering services.
- Art. 18 No action taken
- Art. 19 Voted to accept from Charles D. Cahoon of Bopford, a strip of land 50' wide x 352' long,

running between Topsfield Road and the Town Recreation Area; and as an extension of this, make available as a way, open to the public in the town recreation area, a strip of land 50' wide x 500' long, this 852' by 50' to have a 24 foot wide road, constructed by C. D. Cahoon at his expense, to meet town specifications; and to direct the selectmen to transfer the existing road to the town recreation area 20' wide x 347' long to C. D. Cahoon or his nominee, all as per drawing submitted to Town Clerk.

Art. 20 Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000.00 for the purchase of a new 750 gallon pumping engine for the fire department.

Art. 21 Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for the purpose of repairing and adding to the garage facilities for the fire department.

Art. 22 Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the construction and installation of "dry hydrants", so-called, by the fire department.

Art. 23 Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,200.00 to trade the present police cruiser for a 1962 model.

Art. 24 A proposal to amend the zoning By-law was defeated 145 yes, 89 no. A two thirds vote is required for passage. The vote was taken by secret ballot with the use of check lists.

Art. 25 Some clarification of the alcoholic beverage question on the town election ballot was made under this article.

The meeting was adjourned at 12 o'clock.

Special Town Meeting, Oct 26, 1962

The voters of Boxford met at Masconomet Regional District School on Oct. 26, 1962, at 8 PM with William J. Greener, Jr., presiding as moderator. After a moment of silent prayer, the articles of the warrant were acted upon as follows:

Article 1; Voted 269 yes, 4 no, by hand vote, that the zoning by-law be amended by substituting the latest "Proposed Revised Zoning By-Law" for which public hearings were held on August 20th and September 10th, 1962; which revision as set forth in the document on file with the town clerk and with the following changes as set forth in the recommendation and report of the Planning Board also on file with the Town Clerk and submitted herewith:

Page 2 - Zoning map date to read August 20, 1962

Page 5 - (Section V-A-3): Delete word "residences" and substitute word "residents".

Page 6 - (Section V-B-1): Delete "all agricultural uses permitted in other districts" and substitute "all uses permitted in Section V-A, subsections 2, 3, 5, 6, 9, 11(h), and 11(i).

10-8 Page 7 - add new section ¹⁰⁻⁸ - "Rest or nursing home"

Page 9 - (Section V, subsection E("c")) at end of second paragraph on top of page 9): delete "Section VI-B-C-2" and substitute "Section VI-B-2-C)".

Page 10 - (Section V, subsection E("c")) (e) last paragraph next to last line): delete "Agricultural District or in" and substitute "Agricultural District or if";

Page 11 (Section VI-B, subsection 2): after "Lot Area" insert "(lot as defined in Section VIII, subsection 7)".

Page 11 (Section VI, subsection 2-b): delete "the minimum lot area in" and substitute "the minimum

lot area within" - , also add to paragraph "except as provided in Section V-B-10-f."

Page 13 - (Section VI-B-6(b)): delete "VI-H" and substitute "Section VI-H, and".

Page 17 - (Section VI-G-1(a)): delete "neighboring building, as hereinafter defined," and substitute "building on an abutting lot."

Page 18 (Section VI-H): delete "after such submission" and substitute "after submission to the Planning Board."

Page 20 (Section VIII, Item 7, 3rd line): delete "described in an application for a permit" - also delete (6th line) "accompanying application for a building permit."

Page 20 (Section IX, item A): add the following - "the Inspector of Buildings with the approval of the Board of Selectmen may, and if required by them, shall institute appropriate legal proceedings to enforce this By Law and restrain by injunction any violations thereof."

Page 21 - (Section IX-D-~~2~~): add "whenever such permit is refused because of some provision of this By-Law, the reason therefor shall be clearly stated in writing."

Page 23 (Section X-b - 2nd paragraph): delete "together with deed and bill of sale to Town."

Article 2. Voted to transfer the sum of \$100.00 from Memorial Day account to the Land Damage Account.

Article 3, Voted to transfer the sum of \$150.00 from the Road Machinery Fund to the Road Machinery Maintenance account.

Article 4. Voted to transfer \$400.00 from the Insurance Account - \$200.00 to Elections and \$200.00 to Civil Defense

Art 5. Voted to postpone indefinitely.

Art 6. Voted 230 yes, 91 no, by hand vote that certain property, now of Maurice H.

Shulman et ux and Moses Alper et ux

Bounded generally southerly and southwesterly by Ipswich Road, 1815'; generally westerly by Baldpate Road, 2417'; north-easterly, northwesterly, southwesterly and northwesterly by Lot 3, land now or formerly of Shulman-Alpers, 165.79', 244.78', 125.10', and 77' respectively; generally northerly by Baldpate Pond, 3047'; easterly, northerly, westerly, and northerly by land now or formerly of John H. Chaplin Estate, 610', 1298', 409', and 295' respectively; generally north-easterly by land now or formerly of Ralph Morse and land now or formerly of Elmer S. Jones et al, by a brook and approximately by the Boxford-Georgetown Town Line, 840'; northerly by said Elmer S.
