Annual Town Meeting

March 2, 1964

The voters of Roxford met at the Macconnet Regional School on March 2, 1964 at 8 p.m. with William J. Greenler, Jr. presiding as moderator. Rev. Arthur J. White of the First Congregational Church offered a prayer at the opening of the meeting. Miss Janice Hopping, accompanied by Mrs. Marie Smith, sang "The Star Spangled Banner". The articles of the warrant were disposed of as follows:

- Art. 1. Voted to accept the reports of the Town Officers and Committees as printed in the Town Report.

Voted that in the future, the complete recapitulation sheet used by the assessors in arriving at the tax rate be printed as part of the assessors' report in the Town Report.

The School Building Committee reported that the new Spofford Pond School was 90% complete and would be ready for occupancy in September, 1964.

- Art. 2. The suggested budget was adopted as printed with two exceptions: Town Reports was increased from \$1,300.00 to \$1379.65; School House Notes was decreased from \$3200.00 to \$3,000.

- Art. 3. Voted to appropriate \$1,500.00 for the maintenance of Road Machinery, said amount to be transferred from the Road Machinery Fund.

- Art. 4. Voted to appropriate \$15,000.00 for the Reserve Fund, said amount to be transferred from the Overlay Reserve.

- Art. 5. Voted to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow money from time to time, in anticipation of the revenue of the financial year beginning Jan. 1, 1964 and to issue a note or notes therefor, payable within one year, and to renew any note or notes as may be given for a period of less than one year in accordance with Section 17, Chapter 44 of the General Laws.

- Art 6. Voted to pass over.

- Art 7. Voted to increase the compensation for town labor as follows: from \$1.50 to \$1.75 ^{per hour} where

applicable, and from 1.90 to 2.15 per hour where applicable. A hand vote showed 169 yes, 50 no.

Art. 8 Voted that the sum refunded from the County on account of dog licenses be appropriated and divided equally between the two libraries of the town.

Art. 9 Voted that the sum of \$1,750.00 be raised and appropriated and divided as follows between the two libraries: \$1,000.00 to the East Parish library, and \$750.00 to the West Parish library.

Art. 10 Voted to pass over.

Art. 11 Voted unanimously to transfer \$2,000.00 from the Stabilization Fund for the purpose of trading the present police Cruiser for a 1964 model.

Art. 12 Voted to raise and appropriate \$80,000.00, and to transfer \$20,000.00 from Overlay Surplus Revenue, for the purpose of adding to the Stabilization Fund as provided by Section 5 B, Chapter 40, General Laws.

Art. 13 Voted that the Committee appointed pursuant to the vote of the Special Town Meeting of March 25, 1954, to study and make recommendations regarding codification and revision of the town by-laws, be re-activated and instructed to report at the first special or annual meeting following next June 1; and that further action under this article be postponed until such report.

Art. 14 Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,200.00 for the purpose of establishing a ball field at the new Spofford Pond School site under the jurisdiction of the School Committee.

Art. 15 Voted to take up to \$300.00 from the Rehabilitation Fund to cover the expenses of a bronze plaque, commemorating the nine sons who served in the Civil War.

Art. 16 Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,000.00 for the purchase of a new pump and tank for Engine #3 for the Fire Department.

Art. 17 Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to install windows and a fire escape at the West Bedford

Fire Station, toilet facilities at the East Bedford Fire Station, and miscellaneous repairs and improvements in either station, to be expended under the direction of the Fire Chief.

Art. 18 Voted to appropriate the sum of \$35,000.00 from Surplus Revenue to meet the State & County allotments for highways, the money when reimbursed to be credited to Surplus Revenue.

Art. 19 Voted 174-56 to postpone any action.

Art. 20 Voted to pass over.

Art. 21 Voted to authorize the assessors to enter into a contract, as provided under Section 4 of Chapter 40 of the General Laws, in an amount not exceeding \$10,000.00 for the preparation of assessors' maps and records, said money to be raised and appropriated in the 1964 tax levy.

Art. 22 Voted 98 yes, 146 no, by hand vote against adopting this article.

Art. 23 Voted to appropriate the sum of \$5,400.00 for use in conjunction with allotments from the State and County, for Chapter 90 construction work; said sum to be transferred from funds received from the State under Chapter 822, Acts of 1963.

Art. 24 Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,400.00 to be used in conjunction with an allotment from the State under Chapter 90 Maintenance.

Art. 25 Voted to pass over.

Art. 26 Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for dry hydrants and water holes.

Art. 27 Voted to adjourn at midnight. The attendance was slightly under 300 voters.
