7. Voted that the by-law committee be continued for the purpose of holding public hearings and report further at the next annual meeting.

Annual Town Meeting

250 voters of the Town of Bowdoin met at the Maconomet Regional District School at 8 P.M. for the annual town meeting. William J. Greener, Jr., opened the business meeting after a brief prayer by Reverend Arthur White. The articles of the warrant were disposed of as follows:

Art. 1. Voted to accept the reports of the various town officers and committees as printed in the town report.

Art. 2. Voted to adopt the suggested budget without changes.

Art. 3. Voted to appropriate \$2,500.00 for the maintenance of Road Machinery, said amount to be transferred from the Road Machinery Fund.

Art. 4. Voted to appropriate \$15,000 for the Reserve Fund, said amount to be transferred from Overlay Reserve.

Art. 5. Voted to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow money from time to time, in anticipation of the revenue of the financial year beginning January 1, 1965, and to issue a note, or notes therefor, payable within one year, and to renew any note or notes as may be given for a period of less than one year in accordance with Section 17, Chapter 44 of the General Laws.

Art. 6. Voted to pass over.

Art. 7. Voted to pass over.

Art. 8. Voted to appropriate the sum refunded from the County on account of dog licenses, to be divided equally between the two libraries of the town, with the odd cent, if any, going to the East Parish Library.

Voted that the trustees of both public libraries be requested to report back at the next town meeting in regard to what action they have taken toward the public election of trustees in charge of the operation of each public library.

Art. 10 Voted that the subject matter be referred to the Planning Board.

Art. 11 Voted to accept as public roads the following: Silvermine Road, Trask Road, and King George Drive from the intersection of Kellam Hill Road to the intersection of King John Drive.

Art. 12 ~~To see~~ Voted to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for micro-filming and reproducing early records for preservation.

Article¹³ Voted to amend Section I of the agreement for the establishment of the Masconomet Regional School District by adding the following subsection at the end of Section I:

H. Notwithstanding any provisions to the contrary contained in subsections I (A) and I (C) of this agreement, no member shall be appointed by the local school committee to serve on the regional district school committee, provided, however, that the terms of any members so appointed in 1965 shall not be affected hereby. The member from each town who was formerly appointed by the local school committee shall be elected at the annual town election of each member town in 1966 and shall serve until the annual town election in 1967. In 1967 and in every third year thereafter, each member town shall

at its annual town election elect such member to serve on the regional district school committee for a term of three years and until his successor is elected and qualified. Vacancies shall be filled in the manner provided in subsection I (E) for the filling of vacancies of elected members.

Art. 14 Voted to appropriate the sum of \$34,350.00 from Surplus Revenue to meet the state and County allotments for highways, said money when reimbursed to be credited to Surplus Revenue.

Town Meeting, to include the functions, duties, and authority involved for investigating and planning for the acquisition of such school sites, and planning for constructing and originally equipping school buildings as shall be necessary for the projected elementary school population of the Town, locating and recommending the securing of options upon suitable tracts of lands, and obtaining professional & technical assistance; said committee to report its recommendations to the Town at each Annual Meeting and to the Board of Selectmen at other times as may be appropriate.

B. Voted as follows:

a. The present terms of office of the members of the School Building Committee at large shall expire on March 31, 1965.

b. The Board of Selectmen, before April 1, 1965, shall appoint 4 members at large to the School Building Committee from registered voters residing in the Town of Boxford, one for a term expiring March 31, 1966, one for a term expiring March 31, 1967, one for a term expiring March 31, 1968 and one for a term expiring March 31, 1969.

c. In March 1966 and in March each succeeding year, the Board of Selectmen shall appoint one member at large to the School Building Committee from registered voters residing in the Town of Boxford for a term expiring March 31 four years later.

Voted to raise and appropriate ^{the} sum of ^{50,000.00} money to be added to the Stabilization Fund.

Art. 22
Voted to instruct the Selectmen to appoint a Committee of three members to make a study of the advisability of the town establishing a water system.

Art. 23
Voted to instruct the Selectmen to appoint a Committee of three members to make a study of the space requirements of the various town officers, departments, and boards, and to recommend whether it is advisable to repair and/or change existing facilities to meet these needs.

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of ^{\$}600.00 for the purchase of highway equipment.

The voters of the Town of Bosford met at the Harry Lee Cole School at 8:15 p.m. with 51 voters attending. After a moment of silent prayer, the business meeting was opened by William J. Greener, Jr., the moderator. The articles of the warrant were disposed of as follows:

1. Milton E. Lord, representing the libraries of the town, made a report on the progress made toward conversion from private to semi-public institutions. It was voted that the article be passed over until the next town meeting when concrete action would be presented to the town.
2. Voted to appropriate the sum of \$52.50 received as state aid for libraries for the use of the public libraries in the town, with 60% going to the East Parish Library and 40% to the West Parish Library.
3. Voted to raise and appropriate \$100⁰⁰ for the purchase of speed control signs.
4. Voted to raise and appropriate \$23.39 for the 1965 Census account.
5. Voted to accept as a public way or street, a way shown on plan of Harlan P. Kelsey, Inc., subdivision off Chapman Road and Camp Ground Road alongside lot 11 on said plan, also on plan drawn for William E. Dorman, accepted by the Planning Board on 5-17-65, the way as shown 300 ft to and including the turn-around, to be known as Chapman Way; and voted to accept the sum of \$1,600.00 offered by Mr. William Dorman and to appropriate the same for the Highway Department for the purpose of improving the said road.

6. Voted to accept the legacy, when paid, of \$2,000 for library purposes contained in Article III, Section (g.g) of the Mary Stacy Holmes Trust.
7. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2000.00 to finance a plan of contributory group life insurance and hospital, surgical, and medical insurance for town officers and employees and their dependents under General Laws, Chapter 32B, accepted at the March town meeting.
8. Resolved that the voters of the town should be informed, more fully as to the time and place of any town business meeting.

The voters of the Town of Belford met at the Harry Lee Cole School at 8 pm on Dec. 17, 1965 for a special town meeting. After a brief prayer by Rev. Arthur White, the meeting was called to order by William J. Greener, Jr., the moderator. The action taken on the various articles of the warrant was as follows:

1. Voted to accept the report of the library trustees of the two libraries as printed in a brochure and distributed to the voters of the town.
2. Voted unanimously that the town establish a town agency to be known as the Trustees of the Belford Town Library, under section 10 of Chapter 78 of the General Laws, as follows:
 - 1) said trustees shall be nine in number to be elected by the town at each annual election, three each year for terms for three years; except that at the first election after the adoption of this vote there shall be three elected to serve for three years, three to serve for two years, and three to serve for one year;
 - 2) said trustees shall be charged by the town with providing public library service to residents of the entire town, within such budgetary provision as may be voted by the town;
 - 3) said trustees shall have full authority to appoint and dismiss a town librarian, and such assistants and employees as may be necessary;
 - 4) said trustees shall have full power to negotiate and conclude on behalf of the town appropriate contractual arrangements with libraries or library associations for the upon terms mutually satisfactory and acceptable for the maintenance, operation, and use of the library premises, book collections, and other library facilities belonging to the said libraries or associations, or make any other arrangements appropriate and necessary for the provision of public library service to the town as a whole, subject

always to the availability of budgetary provision for the same as voted by the town.

- 3) Voted to appropriate \$500.00 for Road Machinery Maintenance, said amount to be transferred from the Road Machinery Fund.
- 4) Voted to make the following transfers of funds:
 - \$1400.00 from Disability Assistance to Veterans' Benefits
 - 900.00 from Insurance to Veterans Benefits
 - 63.15 from Moth Suppression to Dutch Elm Disease Control
 - 37.20 from Town Reports to Community House
 - 100.00 from Town Reports to Selectman's Highway Fund
 - 100.00 from Public Grounds to Selectman's Highway Fund
 - 150.00 from Inspection of Slaughter to Plumbing Inspector
 - 300.00 from Interest on Loans to Board of Health
 - 200.00 from Insurance to Board of Health
- 5) Voted to appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars from available funds to acquire an interest in a certain area of land on Middleton Road for highway purposes, said land owned by Mrs. Dunbar Lockwood.
- 6) Voted to pass over.
- 7) Voted to adjourn at 8:40 pm. Sixty voters were present at the meeting.

10. Voted to accept Whitten Terrace as a public road subject to the setting of fixed bounds.
11. Voted to appropriate the sum of \$37,100.00 from Surplus Revenue to meet the State and County allotments for highways, said money when reimbursed to be credited to Surplus Revenue.
12. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for improvements in the fire stations.
13. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for dry hydrants and the maintenance of water holes.
14. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the purpose of trading the police cruiser for a new model.
15. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$175.00 for micro-filming of records.
16. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the purchase of 2 new snowplows.
17. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for recreational planning.
18. Voted to raise and appropriate \$10,108.00 for the purpose of providing the Town's share of the cost of the Regional District School Committee to pay for an architect, or other professional services, to draw plans and specifications for an addition to the regional school together with any re-modelling to the existing building ~~and~~ as may be made necessary thereby, in accordance with the original agreement with the Towns of Middleton and Topshfield establishing the Regional School District as amended by vote of the member towns in 1961 and 1965, and to expressly ratify and confirm the Town's acceptance of said amendments, and to direct the Town Treasurer to pay over said sum to the Regional District School Committee to be used only in conjunction with funds appropriated by the other two member towns for this purpose.

19. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,780.00 for the construction during the year 1966 of a regulation-size baseball field at Boy Scout Park, if included in the overall facility plan to be obtained by the Town Recreation Committee.
20. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,000 for the purpose of establishing and equipping a central communications system for town departments.
21. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 to be used in conjunction with an allotment from the State under Chapter 90 Maintenance.
22. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,000.00 to be used in conjunction with allotments from the State & County under Chapter 90 Construction.
23. Voted to instruct the selectmen to appoint a committee of five members to be known as the Bowford Water & Drainage Committee: said Committee to be appointed for the purpose of planning the development and protection of water sources within the town.
24. Voted to authorize the selectmen and the Water & Drainage Committee to engage a professional engineering company to conduct a survey of the potential source or sources of water supply for the town, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 therefor.
25. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3400.00 for the Conservation Committee.
26. Voted to pass over
27. Voted to repair and improve a section of Willow Road, from Washington St. to Georgetown town line, and to appropriate therefor the sum of \$3,390.00, said sum to be transferred from the funds received from the State under Chapters 679, Acts of 1965.
28. Voted to pass over
29. Voted to enact the following by-law
 "Any person or firm requiring the services of the Tree Warden shall pay for such services at an hourly rate established by the selectmen. Such compensation

shall be paid directly to the said Tree Warden."

30. The following resolution was voted: hereafter, the flyers containing the articles of the warrant & the budget (suggested) for the annual town meeting will indicate the sponsor of each article, and also show the recommendation of the Finance Committee.

Mr. Greenler, the moderator, announced the completion of twenty years in that position, and thanked the townspeople for their helpfulness in making the meetings operate smoothly over that period.
 The meeting was adjourned at 10:30 P.M.
