1A. AWARD OF BID - TRAFFIC SIGNAL UPGRADES PROJECT

WHEREAS the Village received 3 bids for the Traffic Signal Upgrades Project (VM-1112-4); and

BE IT RESOLVED that the bid for the Traffic Signal Upgrades Project (VM-1112-4) is hereby awarded to Power Line Constructors, Inc. with their bid proposal of \$76,870 and a 5% contingency component of \$3,843 for a total project cost not to exceed \$80,713.

THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Village Manager is hereby authorized and directed to execute a contract with Power Line Constructors, Inc. for said project.

Dear Philip:

Bids were opened on Wednesday, February 20, 2013 at 11:00 a.m. for the above referenced project. Present at the bid opening were David J. Turiano, P.E. Village Engineer, and Robin Rizzo, Treasurer.

Three bids were received ranging from \$76,870.00 to \$78,785.00 as shown below. The bids are lump sum.

Vendor	Total
Power Line Constructors, Inc.	\$76,870.00
Syracuse Signal Systems, Inc.	\$77,446.82
Verde Electric Maintenance Corp.	\$78,785.00

The bids were reviewed by Jose Matos of TRC Engineers, Inc.; his review letter is attached. As indicated above, Power Line Constructors, Inc. provided the lowest responsible bid for the project.

Joe Lomonico was contacted as a reference check for Power Line Constructors, Inc. Mr. Lomonico's firm was hired by the City of Utica for Contract D031570 – Traffic Signal Upgrade Phase 1, a \$1.5 million job. He advised that Power Line is very knowledgeable and has a skilled work force. He did not encounter any problems with their work which was started and completed in a timely manner. Their project included the upgrading of 20 intersections including GPS control cabinets, signal buttons, poles, etc.

Chris Smith of Fisher Associates was also contacted as a reference check. Fisher Associates was the engineer which designed the specifications for the City of Elmira for

Contract D030151 – Elmira Signal Upgrade Corridor 2 Phase 2, a \$1.5 million job. Mr. Smith advised that Power Line Constructors did a good job and the project was completed in a satisfactory manner.

The following is a summary of what my department believes is a conservative project budget given the scope of work proposed and the compressed timeframe for completion:

Remaining Project Cost	Project Bid
Construction Cost	\$ 76,870.00
5% Contingency	3,843.00
Engineering Inspection	Encumbered
Total Project Cost	\$ 80,713.00

Based on the above, it is my recommendation that the VBM award the contract to Power Line Constructors, Inc. at a cost of \$76,870.00 and the complete project construction cost be capped at \$80,713.00.

Bids were opened on Wednesday, February 27, 2013 at 11:00 a.m. for the above referenced project. Present at the bid opening was David J. Turiano, P.E. and Gerald Quartuccio. Four bids were received with the bid tabulation below.

The scope of work includes electrical work and related installations to facilitate the installation of the SCADA control panels and antennae located at four (4) sites throughout the Village.

The bids were reviewed by the Village of Briarcliff Manor. The low bidder is Talt Electric with a bid cost of \$24,400.00. Talt Electric has successfully performed several projects for the Village, including the electrical work at the Full Water Supply Project (FWSP).

Total project costs and available monies are indicated in the below tabulations:

Funds are available under Install Radio Remotes & Auto Dialer System Code H.8397-201.12581 in the amount of \$±150,000.00.

AGREEMENT TO EXTEND INDEXED LUMP SUMMUNICIPAL SNOW AND ICE AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the COMMISSIONER and the MUNICIPALITY have entered into an Agreement No. <u>D014708</u> entitled "Indexed Lump Sum Snow and Ice Agreement between the New York State Department of Transportation and the Municipality of <u>Village of Briarcliff Manor</u>" dated <u>November 16, 2001</u>; and

WHEREAS, the term of the said Agreement is for a period of three years commencing July 1, <u>2001</u> and said Agreement provides that the parties may at the end of each year of the term of the Agreement extend such term for an additional year; and

WHEREAS, the present term of the Agreement, as extended, expires June 30, 2014; and

WHEREAS, Section 7 of the said Agreement provides that the COMMISSIONER shall furnish the MUNICIPALITY with a suitable map for each term of the Agreement, or for any extended term thereof, modified to show the changes, if any, to the State Highways affected by the Agreement.

WHEREAS, Section 9 of the said Agreement provides for an annual update of the estimated expenditure to be determined by the COMMISSIONER subject to the provisions of Section 9 at the time for extension of the Agreement;

WHEREAS, Section 9 of the said Agreement also provides for an adjustment to the actual payment amount based on the intensity and severity of the winter season;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and benefits between the parties,


WITNESSTH:

- 1. The aforementioned "Indexed Lump Sum Snow and Ice Agreement Between New York State Department of Transportation and the MUNICIPALITY" is hereby extended for a period of one year; now to expire on June 30, 2015, unless further extended.
- 2. The State Highways or parts thereof affected by the Agreement are as delineated on the attached map, agreed upon by the COMMISSIONER and the MUNICIPALITY, which shall be effective for the remainder of the term of the Agreement commencing July 1, 2014, unless changed by future agreement between the COMMISSIONER and the MUNICIPALITY.
- 3. All the terms and conditions of the original contract remain in effect except as follows. The indexed lump sum estimated expenditure specified in Section 9 of the aforementioned Agreement shall be \$2,079.12 per lane mile for 2.5 lane miles for a total of \$5,197.80 for the 2012/13 season and for the remainder of the term of the Agreement commencing July 1, 2012, unless changed by future update.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, this Agreement has been executed by the State, acting by and through the duly authorized representative of the COMMISSIONER, and the MUNICIPALITY, which has caused this Agreement to be executed by its duly authorized officer on the date and year first above written.

WHEREAS, Kapson Briarcliff Manor, LLC (Atria 1025 Pleasantville Road) instituted tax certiorari proceedings pursuant to Article 7 of the Real Property Tax Law of the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, the tax certiorari filings were for Town of Ossining assessment years 2006-2011; and

WHEREAS, the tax certiorari filings relate to Village of Briarcliff Manor fiscal years 2007-2008, 2008-2009, 2009-2010, 2010-2011, 2011-2012 and 2012-2013; and

WHEREAS, a Consent Order of the Supreme Court of the State of New York, County of Westchester, was entered on August 20, 2012 and received by the Village via email on February 21, 2013;

WHEREAS, the Consent Order was received after the finalization of the approval of the Village budget for Fiscal Years 2007-2008, 2008-2009, 2009-2010, 2010-2011, 2011-2012 and 2012-2013;

WHEREAS, the Consent Order reduced the tax assessment for the subject property for the Fiscal Years 2007-2008, 2008-2009, 2009-2010, 2010-2011, 2011-2012 and 2012-2013 assessment roll; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees does hereby authorize the refund of the tax bill for Fiscal Years 2007-2008, 2008-2009, 2009-2010, 2010-2011, 2011-2012 and 2012-2013 in the amount of \$226,292.52 based upon the reduced assessment values in the Consent Order.
