Motion seconded by Martin Flynn, and carried unanimously.

BONDING FOR THE FY 2016-2017 CAPITAL PROJECTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE ANNUAL BUDGET: At conclusion of discussion, Martin Flynn made motion that the Selection approves the attached Resolution to approve Bonding for the FY 2016-2017 Capital Projects associated with the Annual Town Budget. Motion seconded by Sue Slater, and carried unanimously.

TOWN BEACH: The Selectmen reviewed the three contracts from F.S.M. Services, Inc. for excavation work on the South West Drainage pipe, the North West Drainage pipe and the Town Park Gate Relocation signed by the First Selectman. Approval for the repairs at Cadigan Park for drainage issues and the boat ramp gate were made at a Special BOS Meeting on March 30, 2016. CCA or its insurance company will be reimbursing the Town for the repairs.

PARKS & RECREATION APPOINTMENT Martin Flynn made motion that the Selectmen appoint Renee Santiago from Alternate to Regular Member on the Parks & Recreation Commission. Motion seconded by Sue Slater, and carried unanimously.

<u>APPROVAL TO APPLY FOR GRANT FOR STREETSCAPE</u>: Mr. Dunn stated that there was a possibility to apply for a grant from the Federal Government for the Town's Streetscape Project. The Selectmen agreed that the Town should apply for the grant.

- (a) recommends that the Town of Brookfield appropriate \$2,835,000 for costs of the 2016-17 Capital Improvements Project and issue its bonds or notes and temporary notes in an amount not to exceed \$2,835,000 to finance the appropriation;
- (b) approves the bond resolution for the 2016-17 Capital Improvements Project, substantially in the form attached hereto, with such changes as the First Selectman shall determine and as are consistent with Board of Finance approval, if any, of said appropriation and bond authorization; and
- (c) requests that a copy of this resolution, including the attachments, be filed with (a) the Town Clerk and the Board of Finance, and (b) if necessary, the Brookfield Planning Commission for approval pursuant to Section 8-24 of the General Statutes.
