- 1. The meeting was called to order at 18:04.

- A. Protecting Water Resources and Managing Storm Water Runoff. This booklet, which is aimed at larger towns, discusses the need to control water runoff and the contaminants that go with it.
- B. Update on the Great Bay Estuary. There is some improvement in the toxic concentration in shell fish, however the amount of nitrogen resulting from municipal sewage plants is a real concern.
- C. Portsmouth Conservation Groups. Such groups are concerned with the scrap metal pile in Portsmouth which is responsible for contaminants leaching into the waters around Portsmouth.
- D. Department of Environmental Services. A letter from DES confirmed that Mr. Guttadaro corrected a wetlands issue of concern.
