


# BURRILLVILLE SEWER COMMISSION

Mr. Wolfe opened the meeting at 9:05 A.M.

**Agenda Item** – Question of accepting the minutes of the Regular Meeting of December 9, 2008; and the question of dispensing with the reading of said minutes.

**Voted** – Mr. Andrews made a motion to accept the minutes of the Regular Meeting of December 9, 2008 and to dispense with the reading of said minutes. The motion was seconded by Mr. Auclair.

## **Correspondence:**

**09-06-54** – Letter from Robin Menoche, 1871 Victory Highway, Glendale regarding connecting to the sanitary sewer system.

**Voted** – Mr. Andrews made a motion to grant an extension until July 1, 2009, with the suspension of penalties when an update of the sewer connection is given in March of 2009. The motion was seconded by Mr. Auclair.

**09-07-55** – Letter from Carol Either regarding property located at 284 Central Street requesting abatement of sewer use charges

**Voted** – Mr. Andrews made a motion to deny the request. The motion was seconded by Mr. Auclair.

**Attorney's Report:** Mr. Kane stated the adoption of the proposed Rules and Regulations should be scheduled for the Commission's February meeting. Mr. Kane suggested to the Commission that when Mr. Geremia addresses the stimulus package, the Commission address the School Street station separately.

**Voted** - Mr. Andrews made a motion to accept the attorney's report. The motion was seconded by Mr. Auclair.

### **Engineer's Report:**

**Discuss potential projects for Stimulus Funding Package** – There was some discussion regarding the stimulus funding package.

**Voted** – Mr. Auclair made a motion to authorize Mr. Geremia to set up an archeological survey to be done on both sites and to seek a categorical exclusion for both. If unable to get a categorical exclusion then Mr. Geremia is authorized to do what is necessary to get a reaffirmation of the existing facilities plan that will include both sites. The motion was seconded by Mr. Andrews.

**Voted** – Mr. Andrews made a motion to send a letter to Beta asking them for the completion of the plans for the Eagle Peak pumping station and to carry the plans forward for the order of approval process. The motion was seconded by Mr. Auclair. Mr. Kane suggested the Commission authorize himself, Mr. Geremia, Mr. Martin, and Mr. Wolfe to negotiate on the bonds if necessary.

**Discuss Sanitary Sewer Construction Standards** – Mr. Geremia reported that a sewer construction standards document has been prepared. Mr. Kane stated that he has a few notes on the standards that need to be reviewed before the adoption.

**Voted** – Mr. Andrews made a motion to accept the engineer's report. The motion was seconded by Mr. Auclair.
